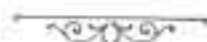

During recent years our Works have been much enlarged and improved. We have therefore every facility for producing high-class work at a reasonable cost, and having been established since 1841, we have a large staff of skilled workmen specially trained for this business.

The designs shown are chiefly selected from buildings we have erected in various parts of the country. We shall be happy at any time to arrange an interview to advise respecting the arrangement of proposed Hot Houses, and to take the necessary dimensions for preparing Plans and Estimates.

We also furnish Plans and Estimates on application by post for any description of Horticultural work, and shall be obliged if clients favouring us with enquiries will at the same time state the position in which it is proposed to erect the building, the purpose for which it is intended, and the most convenient position in which to place the boiler.

We beg to direct attention to our method of building Vineries and Fruit Houses on our Iron Standards, which give the houses great strength in situations exposed to heavy storms of winds, require much less brickwork than houses of ordinary construction, and do not interrupt the passage of the roots from the inner to the outer border (see No. 70, page 47). Plant Houses, etc., can be constructed on this principle as movable houses at a slightly increased cost (see page 40).

Before designing Conservatories intended to be attached to dwelling-houses, it is always advisable that we should either see the proposed position, or receive an elevation of the House, in order that the design for Conservatory may be in harmony with it.

All timber used in the construction of our houses and frames is very carefully selected and seasoned in our own sheds **at least two years** before being used, and all joints are carefully prepared and well painted before being put together, thus ensuring the durability of the work.

During recent years, Teak has come much into favour for building greenhouses, and can be strongly recommended for high-class work, owing to its appearance and great durability. We have erected some extensive ranges in this wood, and have made special arrangements for importing it direct, cut to the required sizes.

We shall be happy to undertake the erection of all descriptions of Hot-Water Apparatus, and from a wide experience in this department are able to ensure the successful carrying out of any work entrusted to us.

Special attention is directed to the cast-iron sectional Boilers shown on pp. 69 to 77. Many thousands of these boilers are now in use and have largely superseded those of wrought iron, as they are far more economical in fuel, require no brickwork setting, are always open to inspection and do not rust nearly so quickly. Being made in sections, they can easily be fixed in an old stoke hole without disturbing the structure.

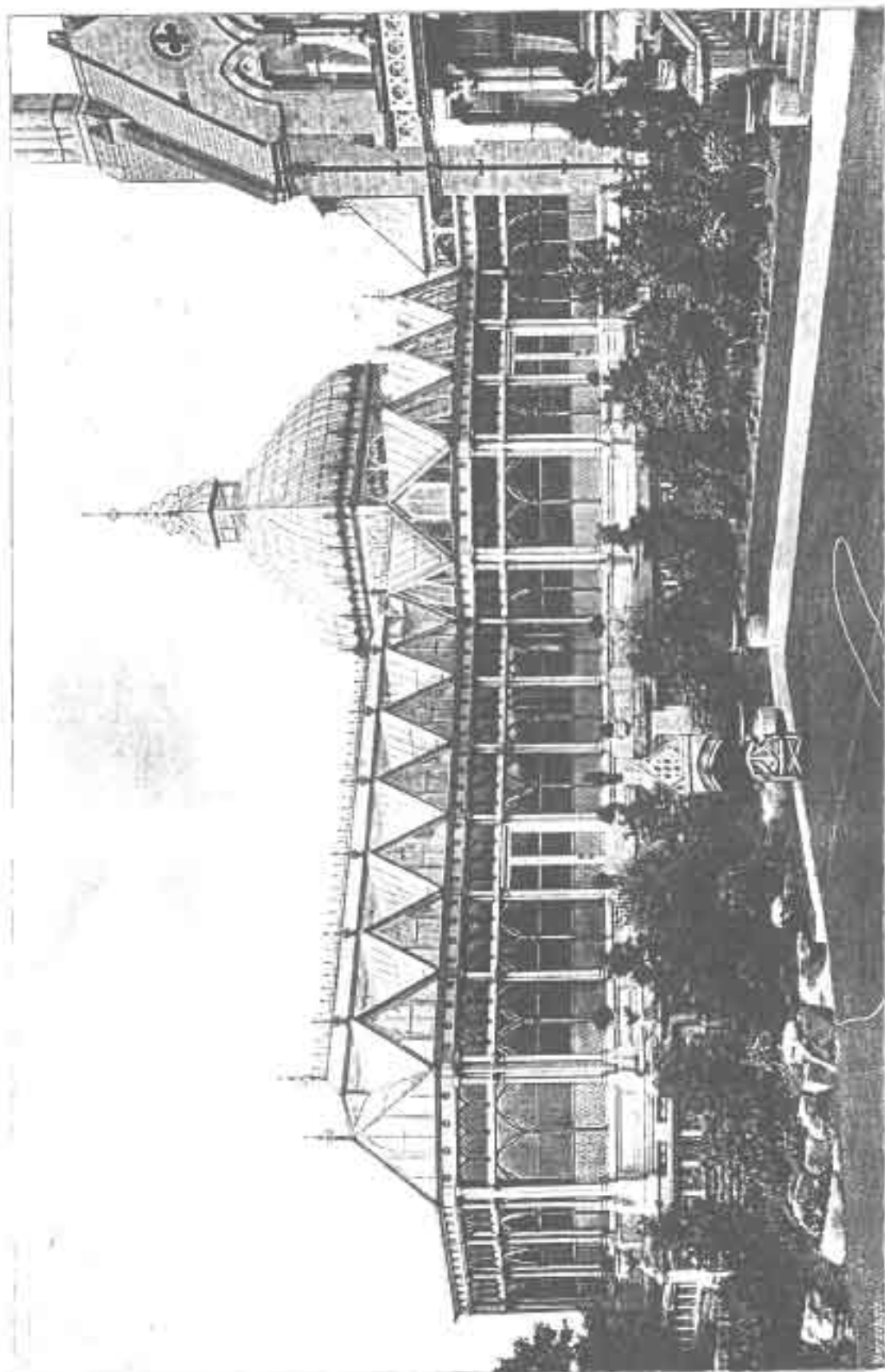

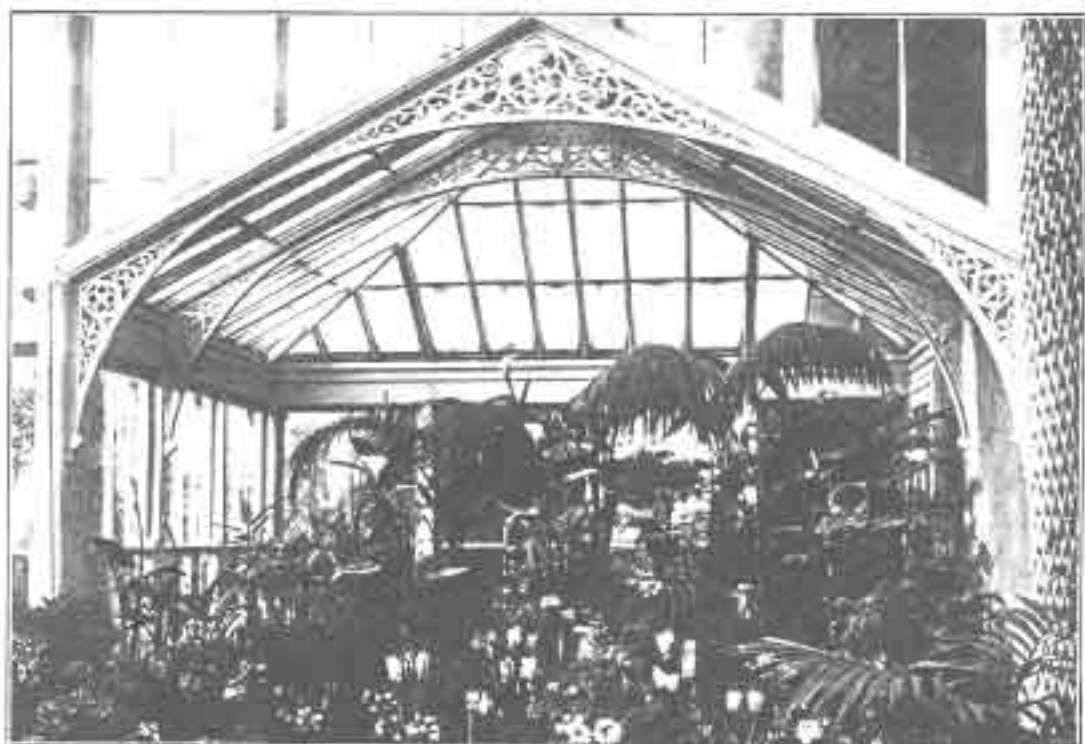


No. 1. CONSERVATORY erected for T. B. Cutts, Esq., Malvern House, Nottingham.

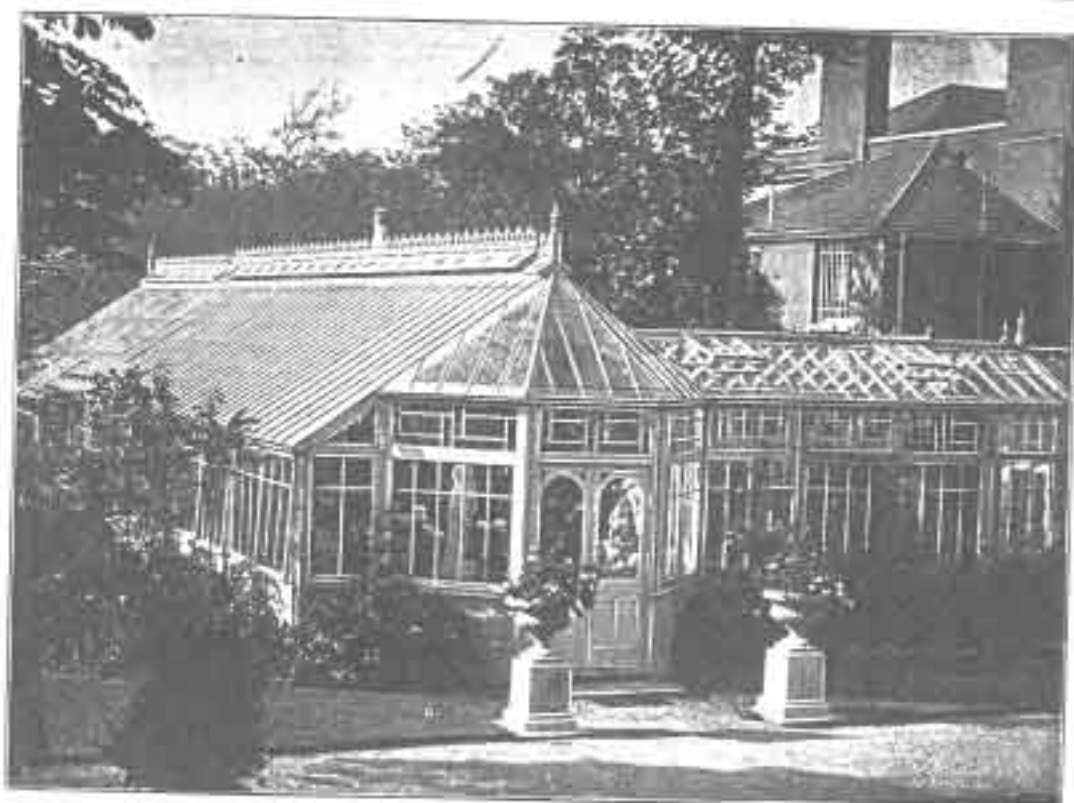


No. 2.—CONSERVATORY erected for A. J. New, Esq., Ruddington, Notts.

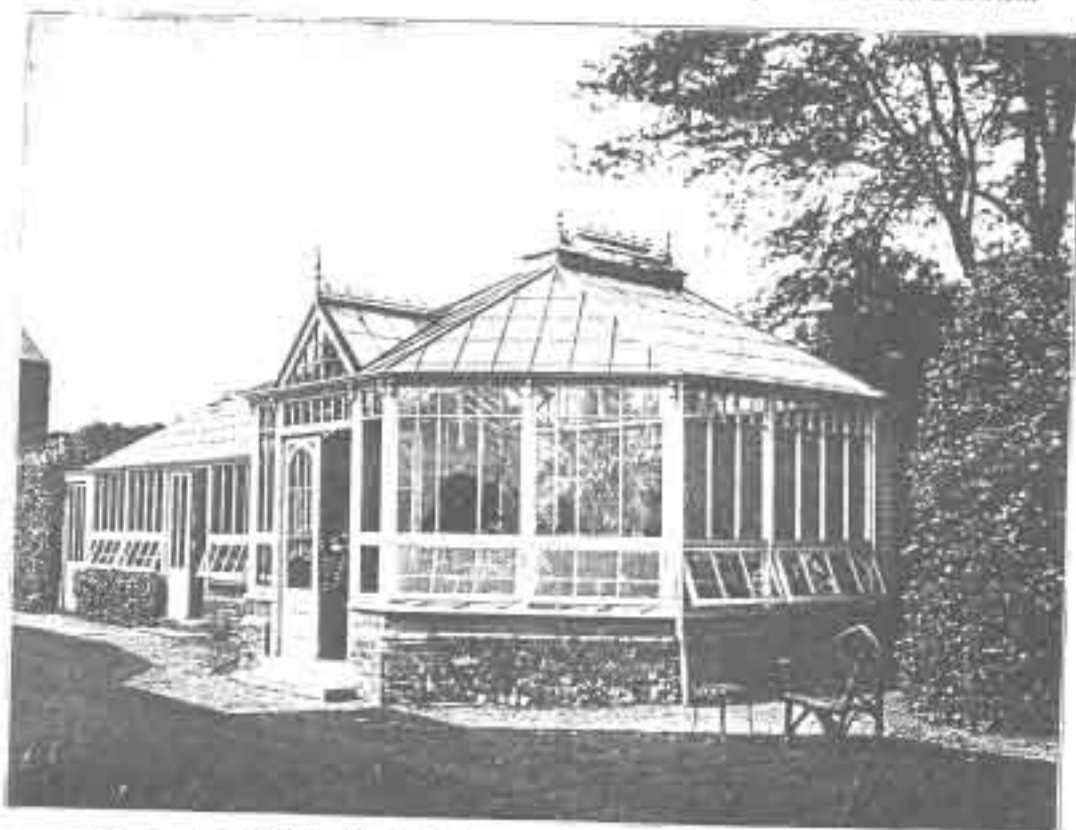


No. 3.—Interior View of above Conservatory.

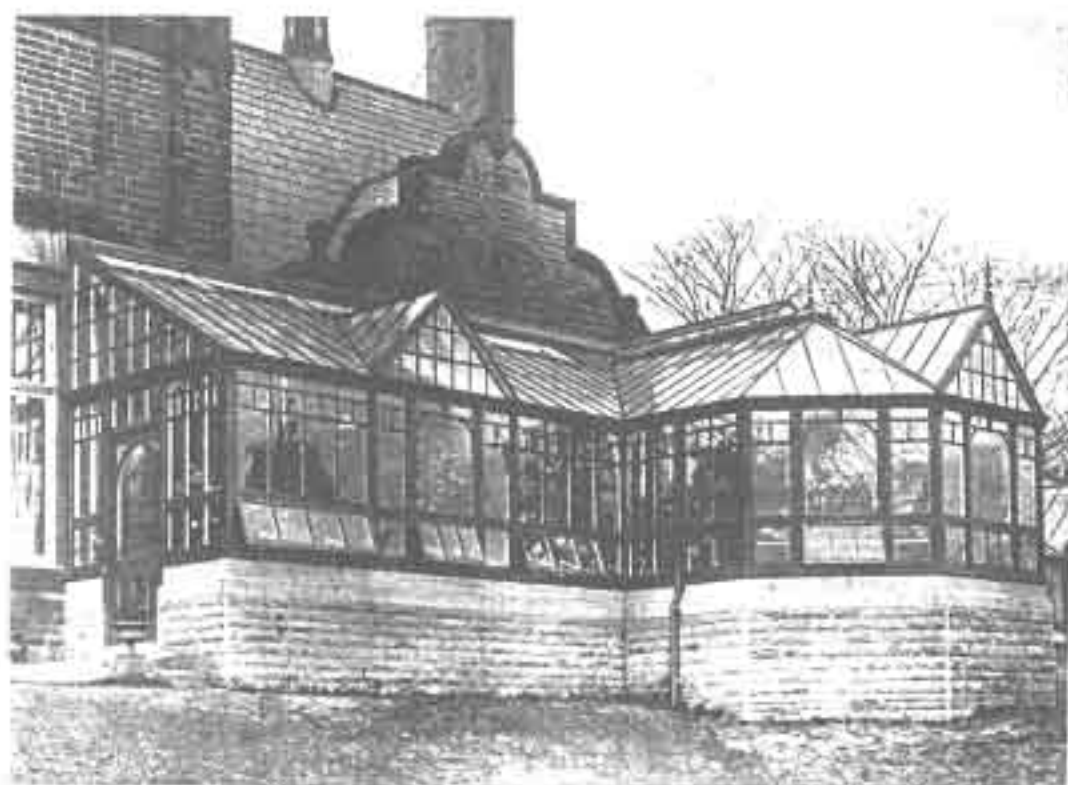


No. 1.—CONSERVATORY erected for J. C. Eno, Esq., Wood Hall, Dulwich.

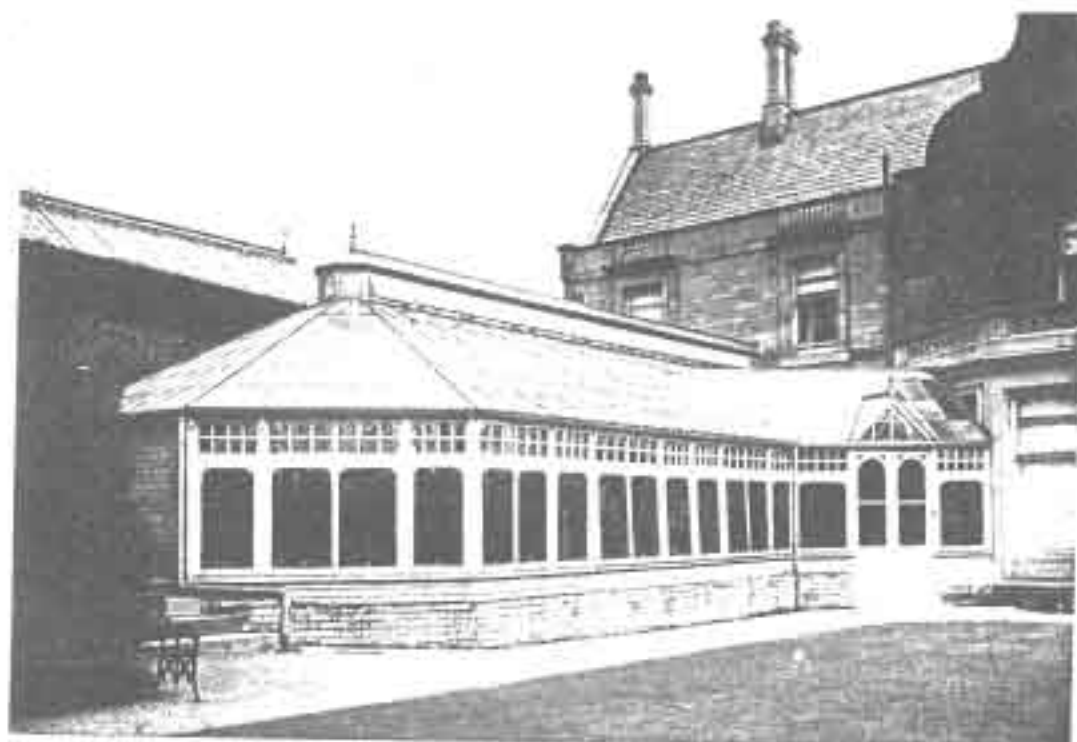


No. 5.—CONSERVATORY erected for H. Kirk, Esq., Beeston, Notts.

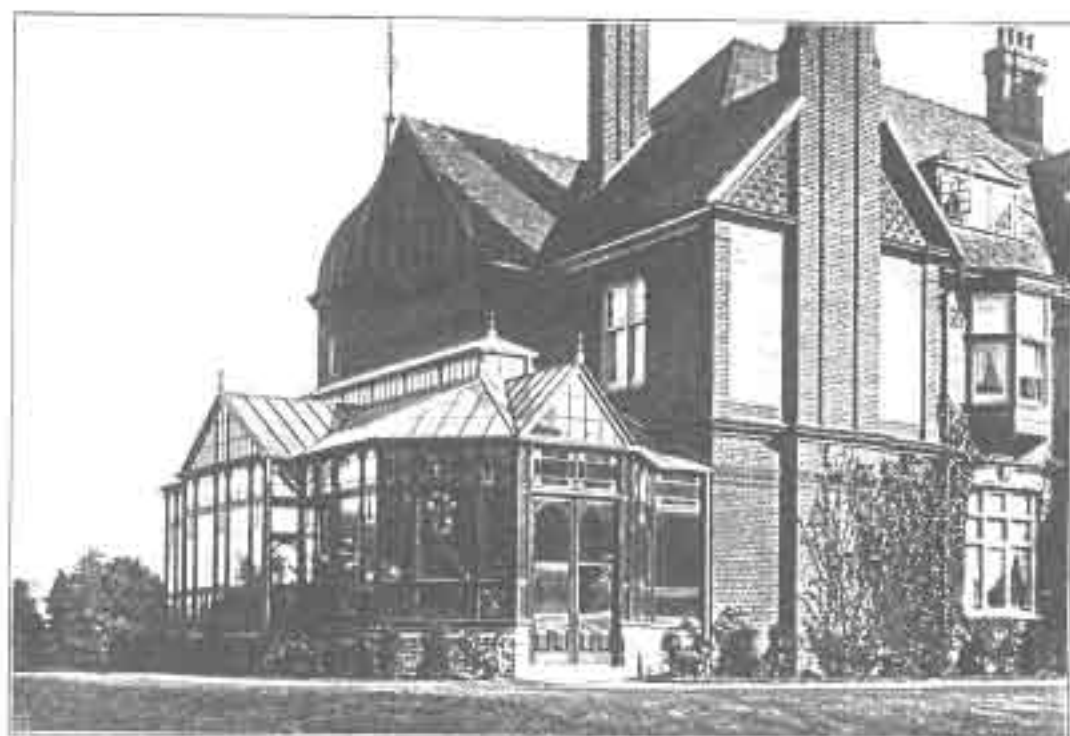


No. 6.—CONSERVATORY, etc., erected for T. W. Green, Esq., Adel, near Leeds.

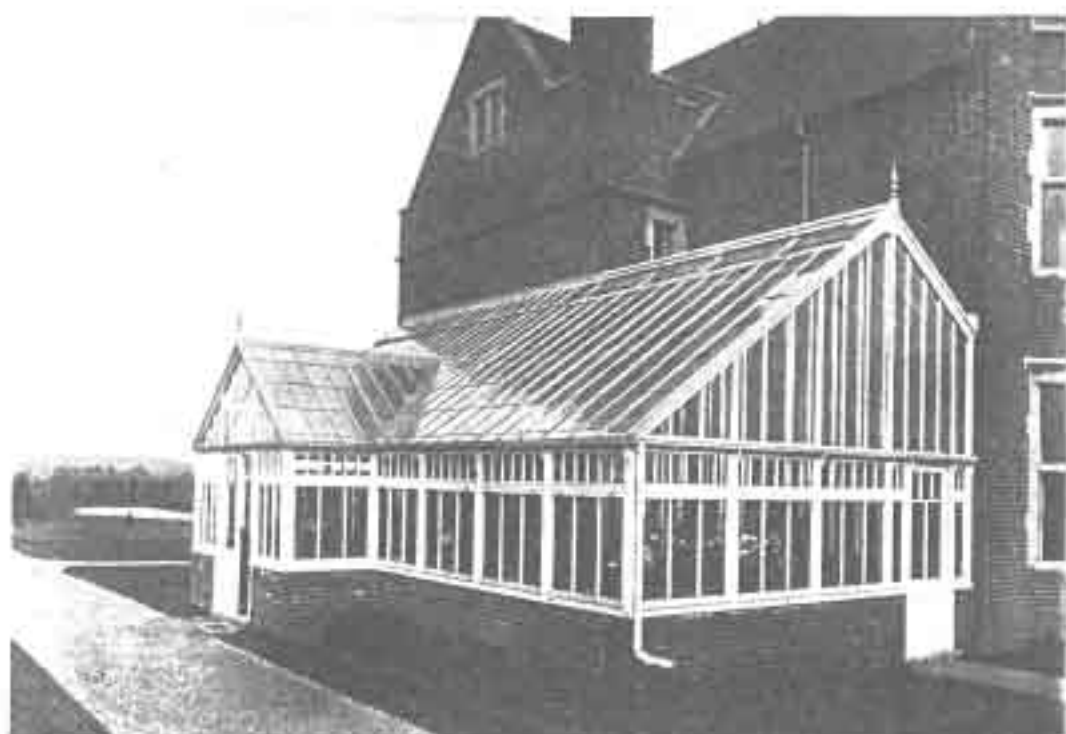

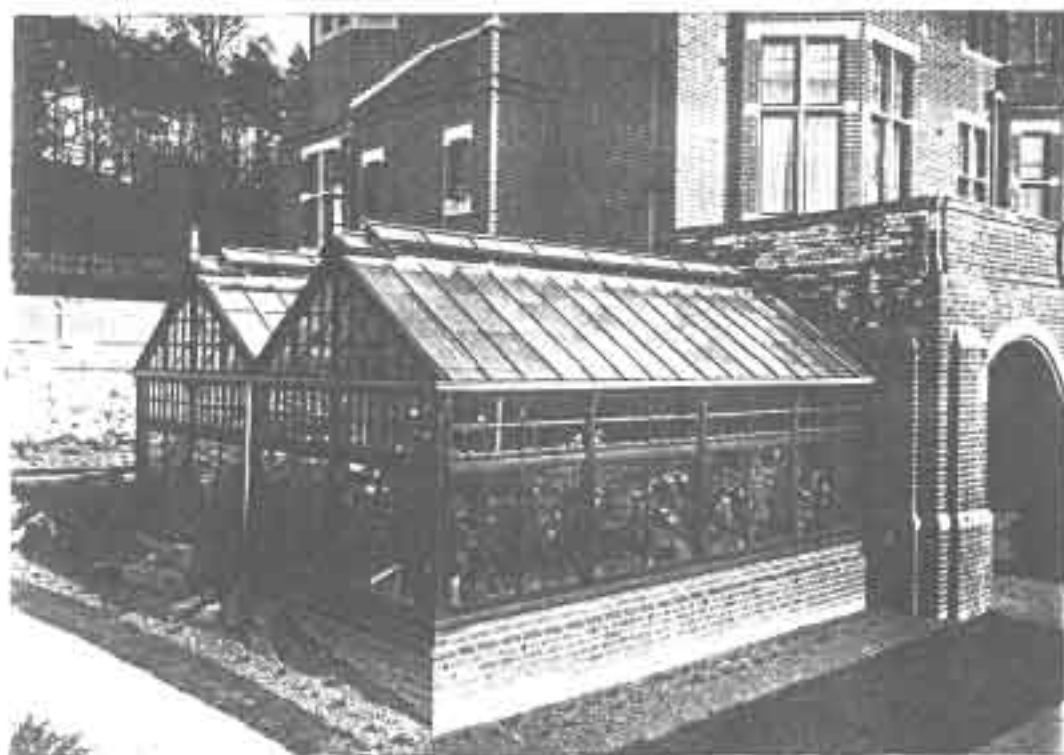

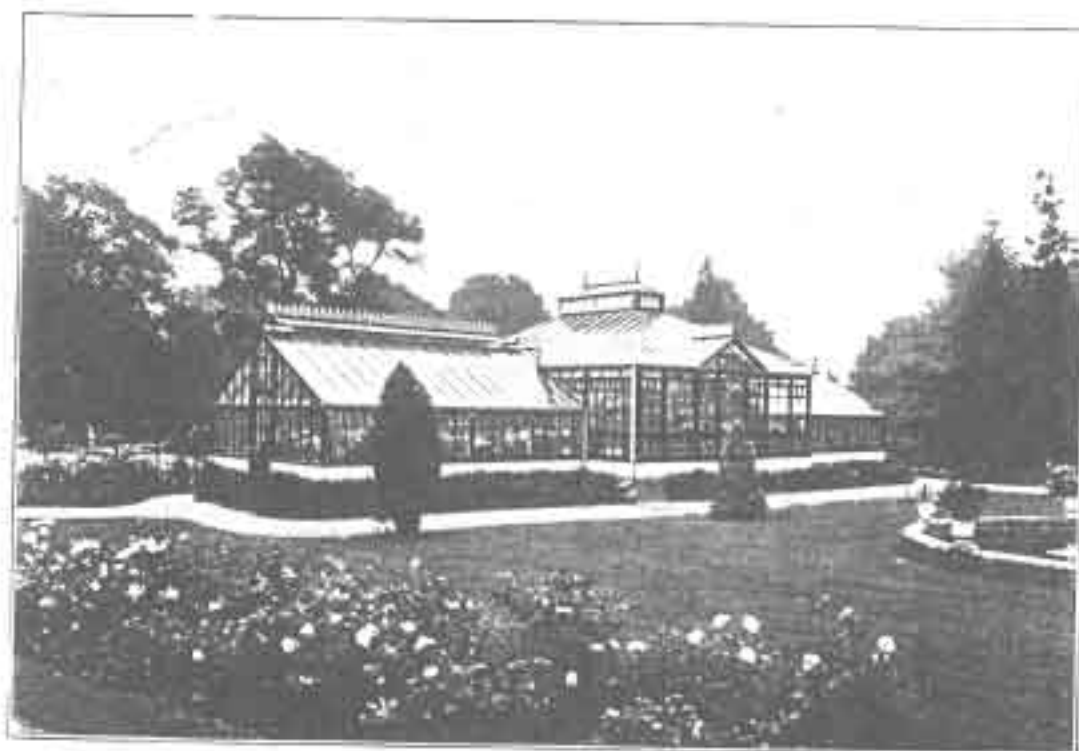


No. 10.—CONSERVATORY erected for Sir S. Faire, Glenfield Frith, near Leicester.

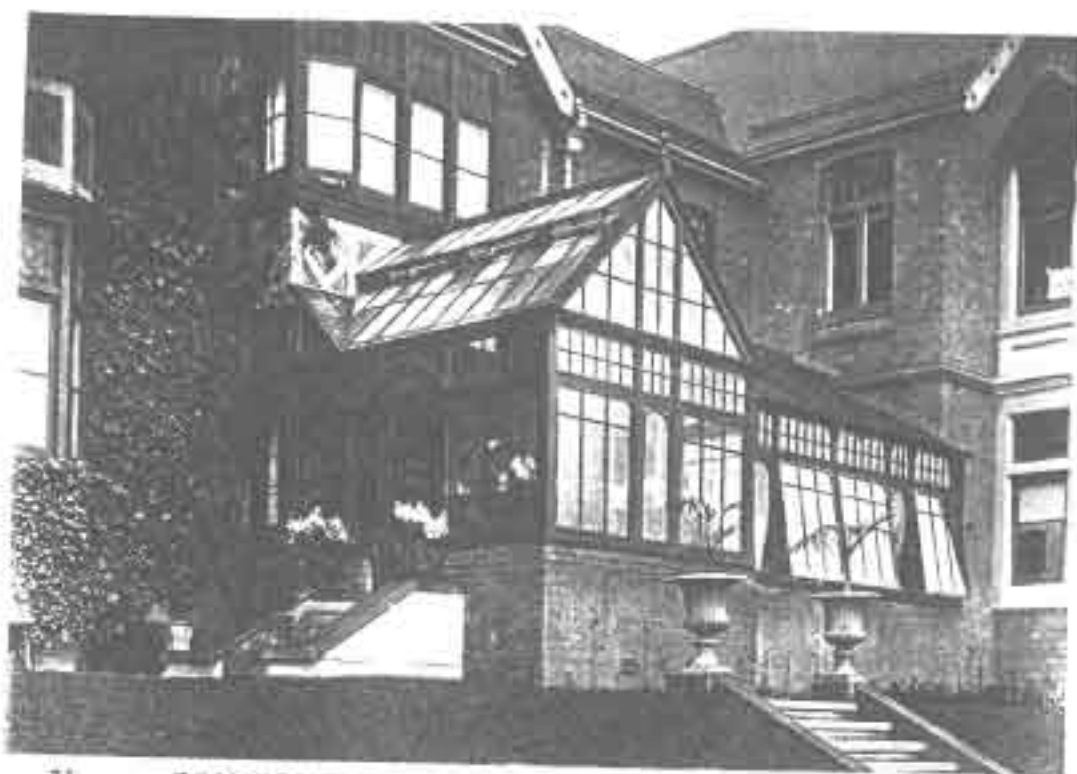


No. 11.—CONSERVATORY erected in Teak for Basil Ellis, Esq., Bevendean, Oxshott, Surrey.

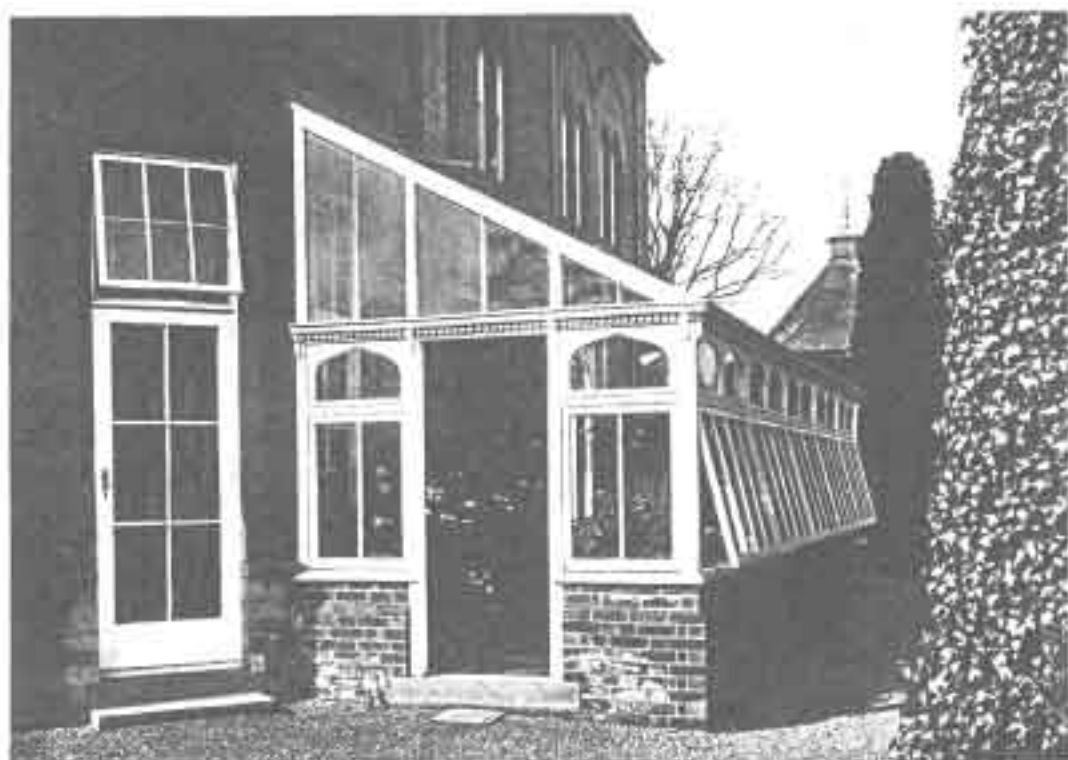

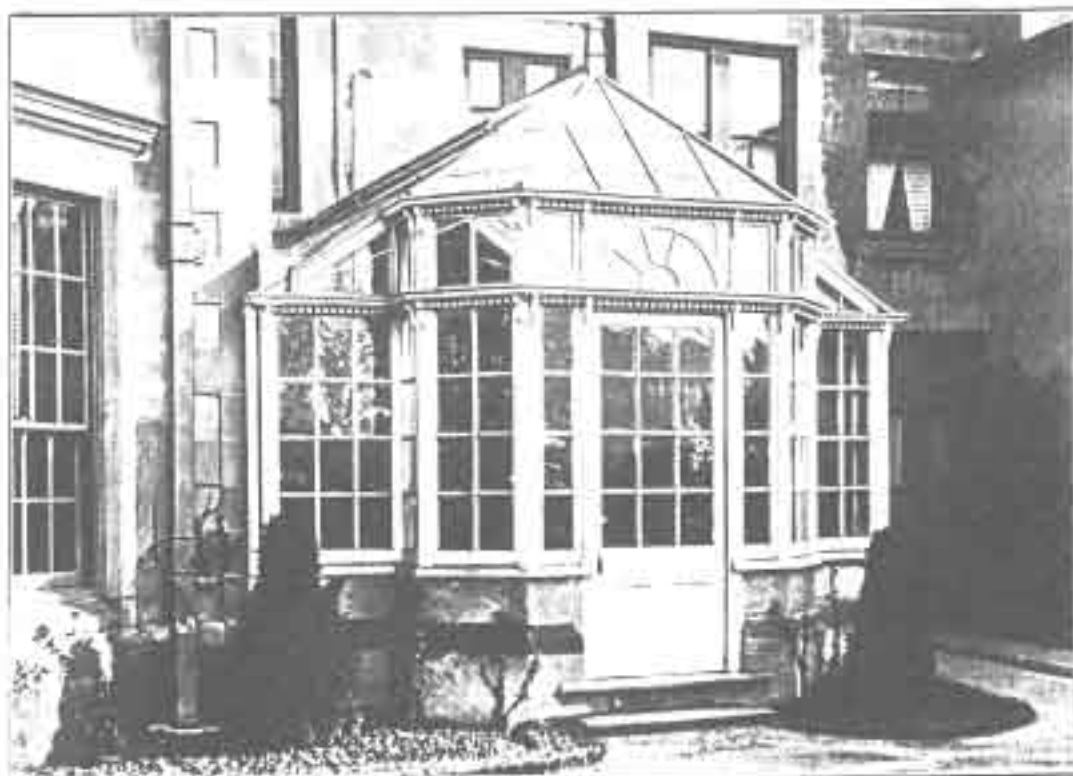
No. 12.—CONSERVATORY AND PLANT HOUSES erected in Teak for  
Sidney Hill, Esq., Langford House, Bristol.



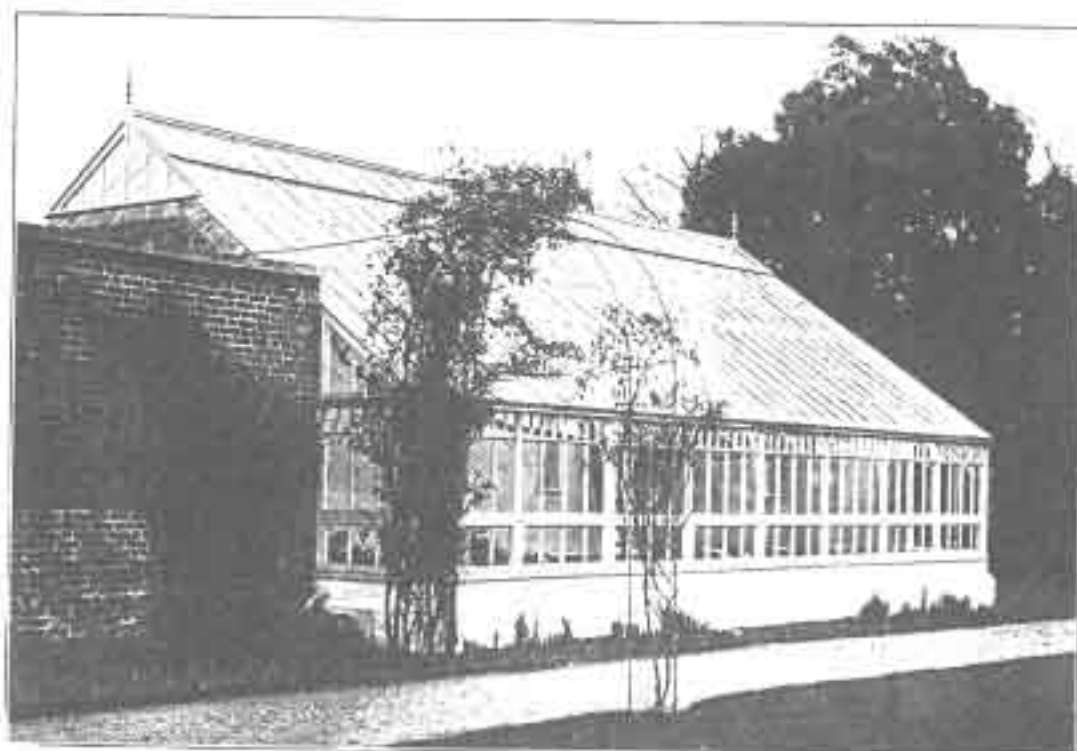
No. 13.—CONSERVATORY erected in Teak for Christopher Spalding, Esq.,

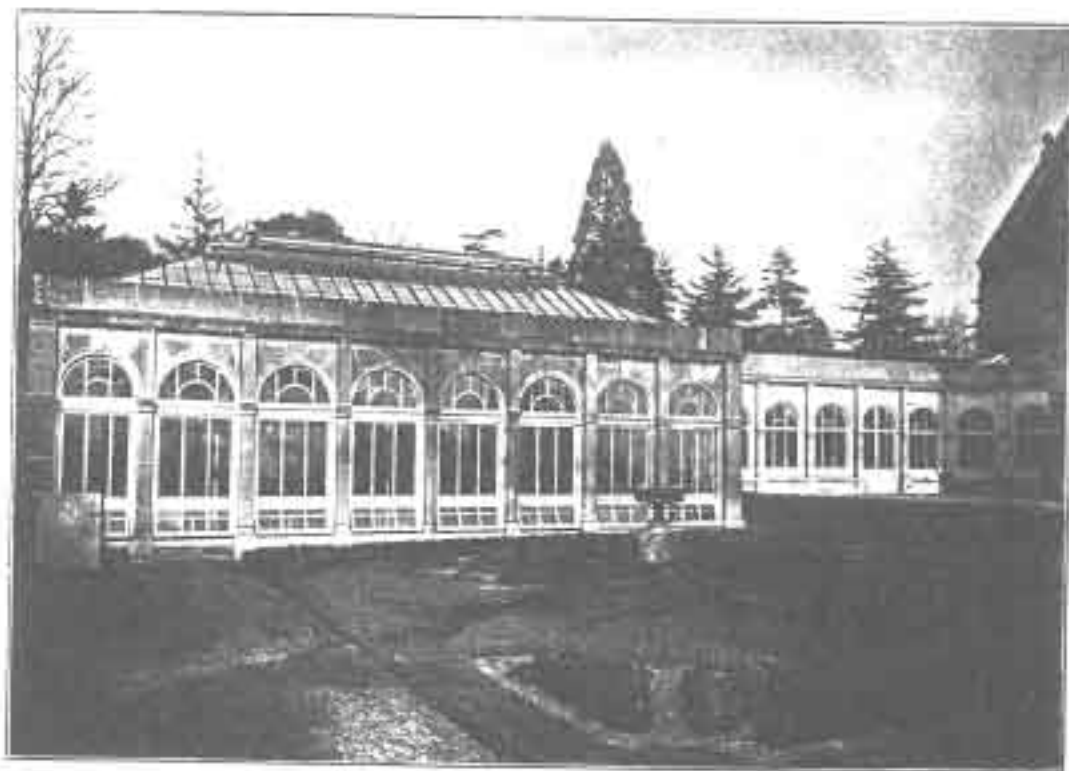

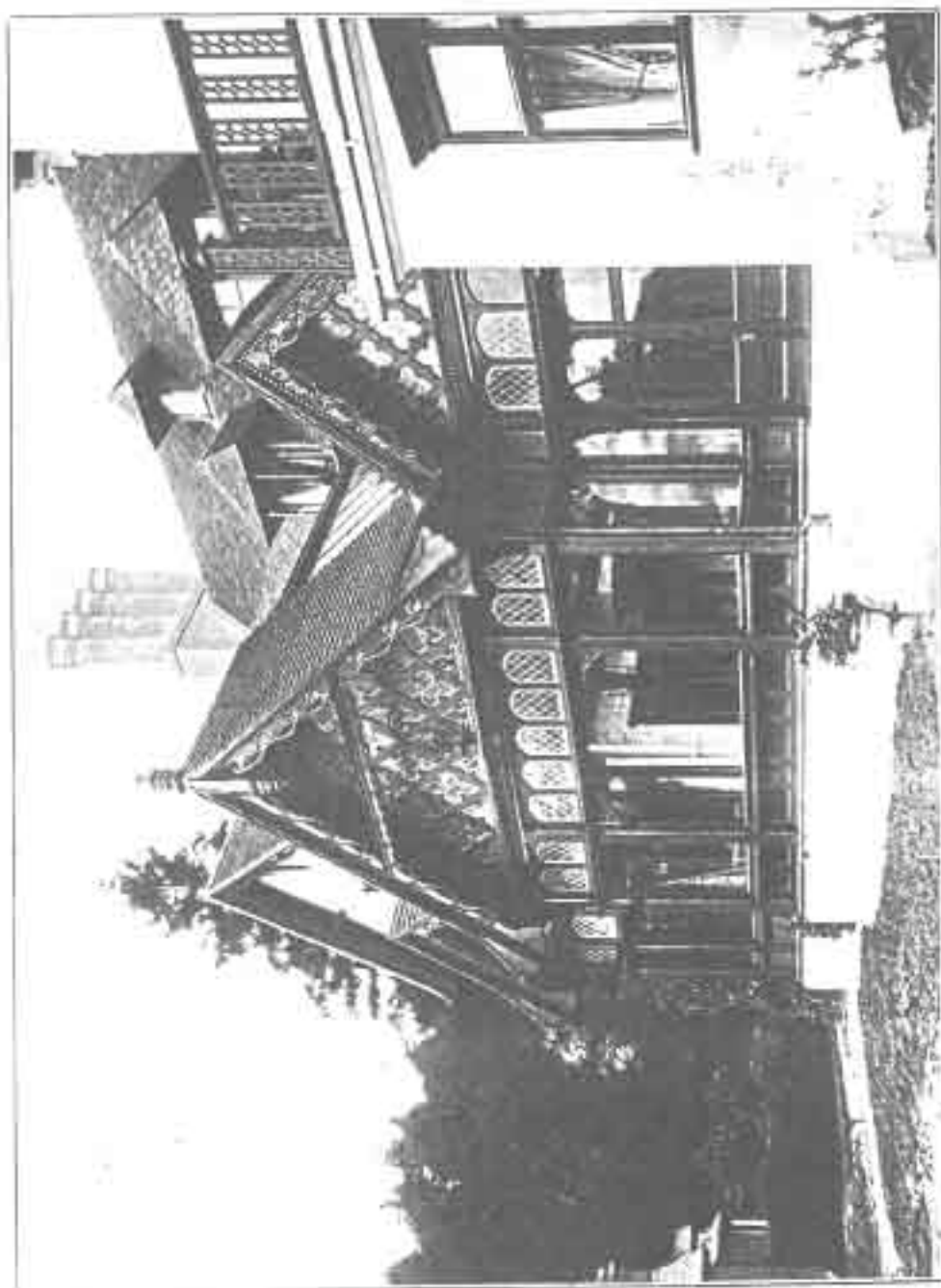


No. 16.—CONSERVATORY erected for Lady Esme Gordon, Paxton Park, St. Neots.

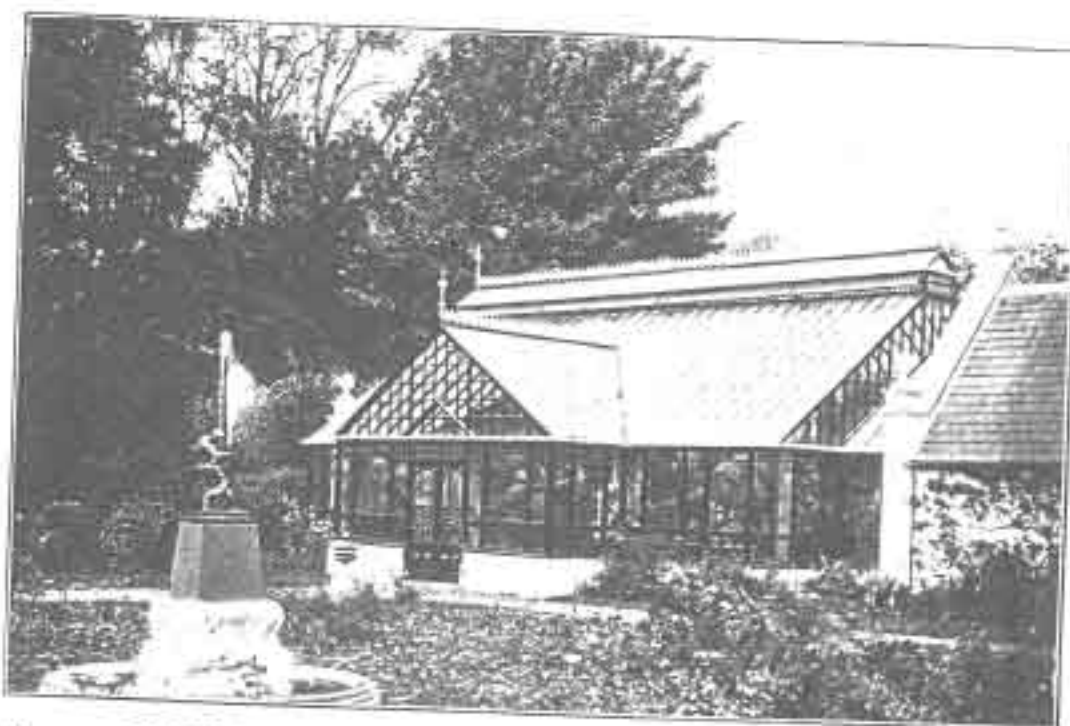

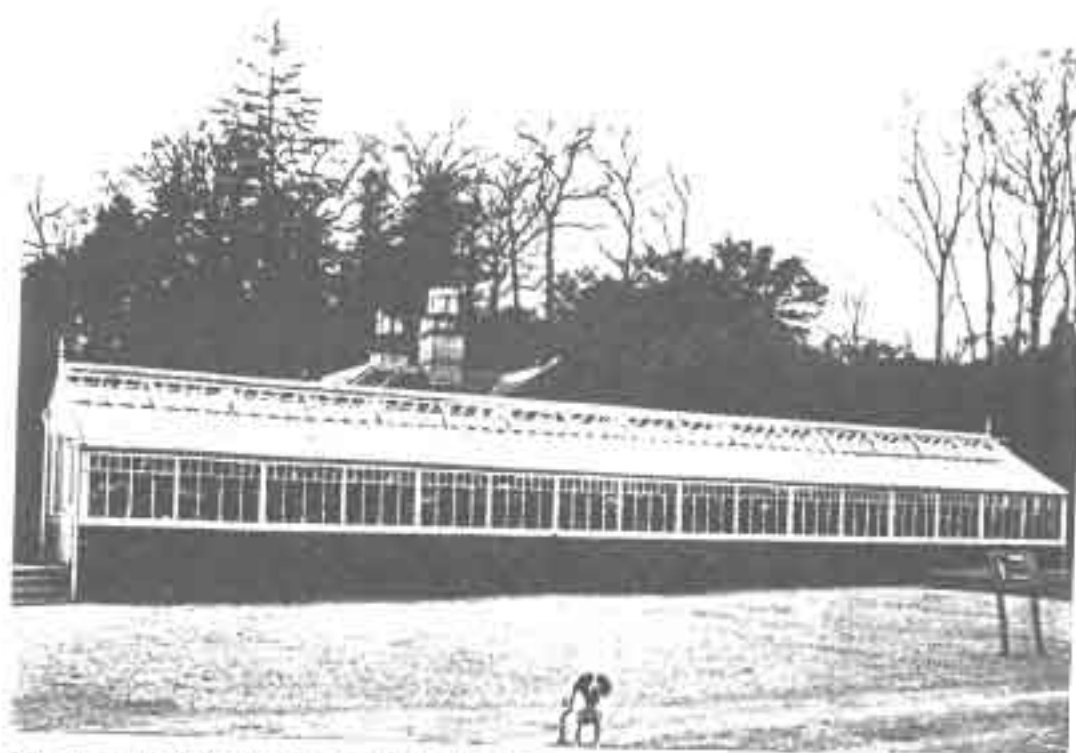
No. 114. CONSERVATORY erected in Teak for Cecil Quentin, Esq., Milland, Liphook, Hants.

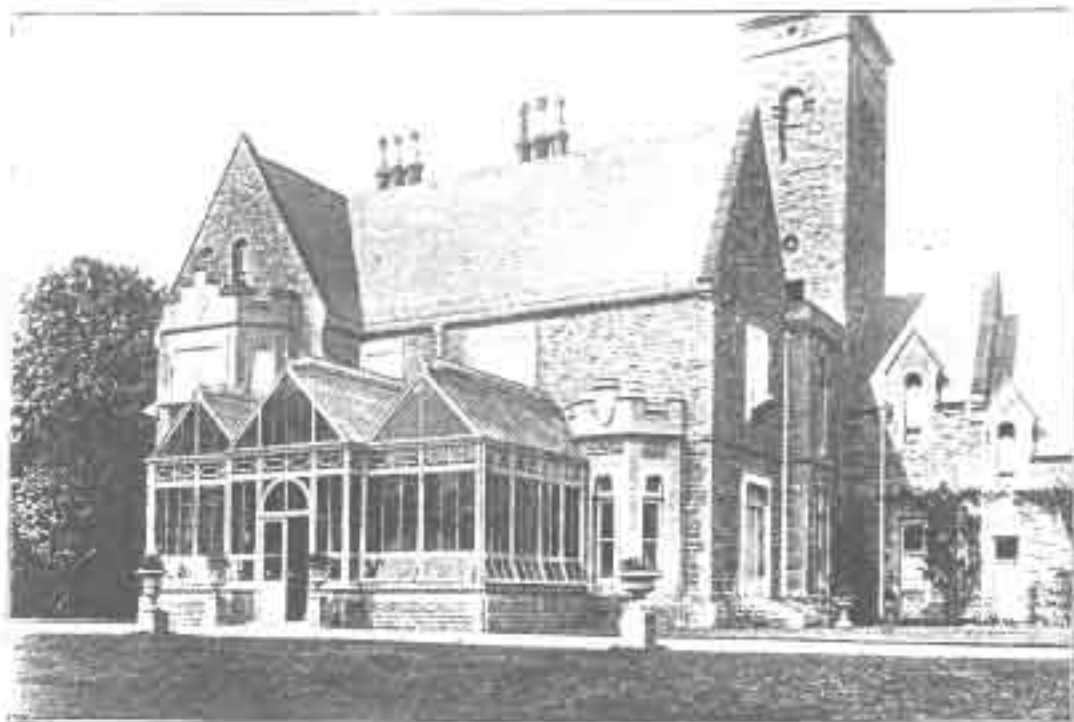


No. 20.—ORNAMENTAL PLANT HOUSE erected for Right Hon. Earl Powis,  
Powis Castle, Welshpool.



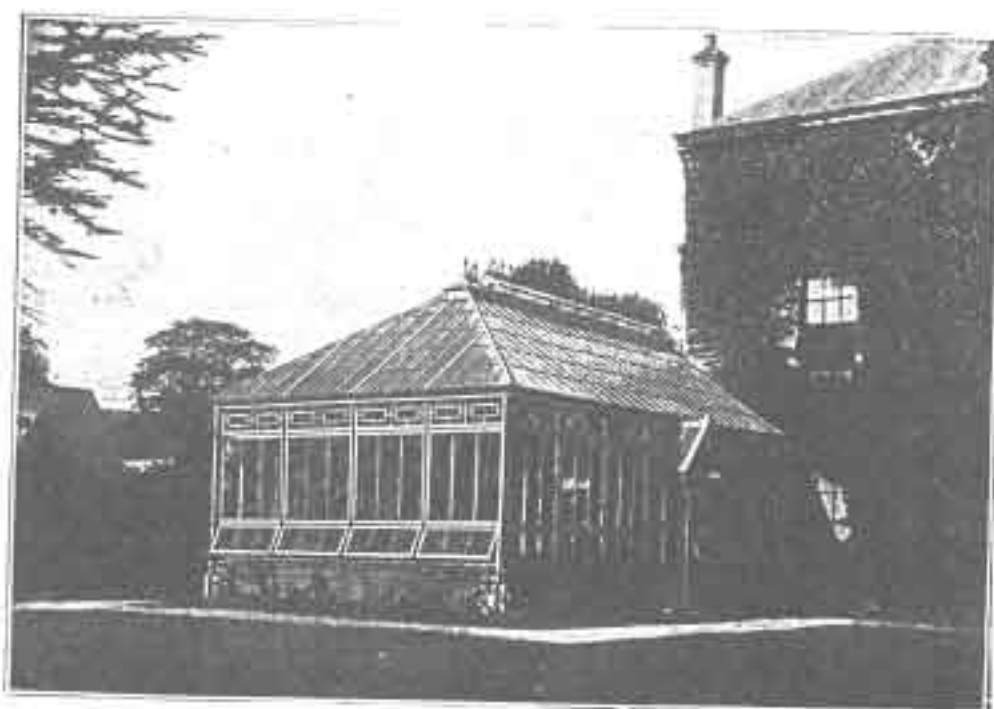


No. 21.—CONSERVATORY erected for Prideaux Brune, Esq., Padstow, Cornwall.

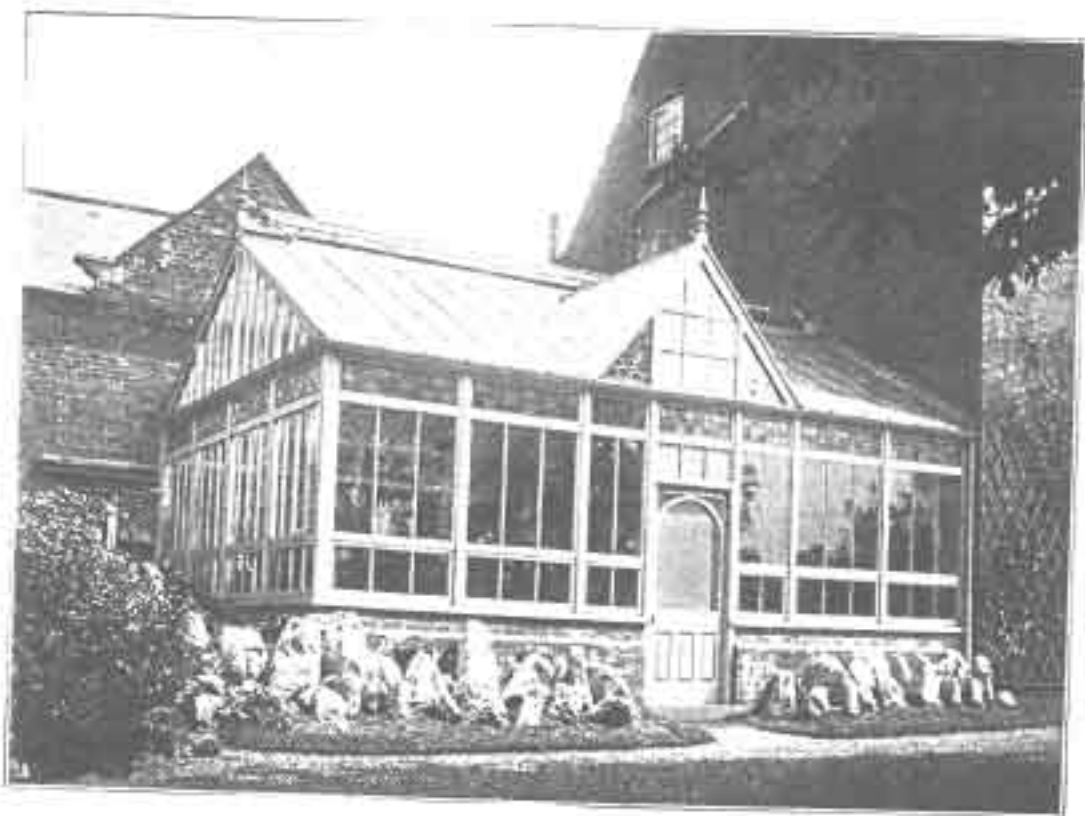


No. 22.—CONSERVATORY erected for M. G. Thorold, Esq.,

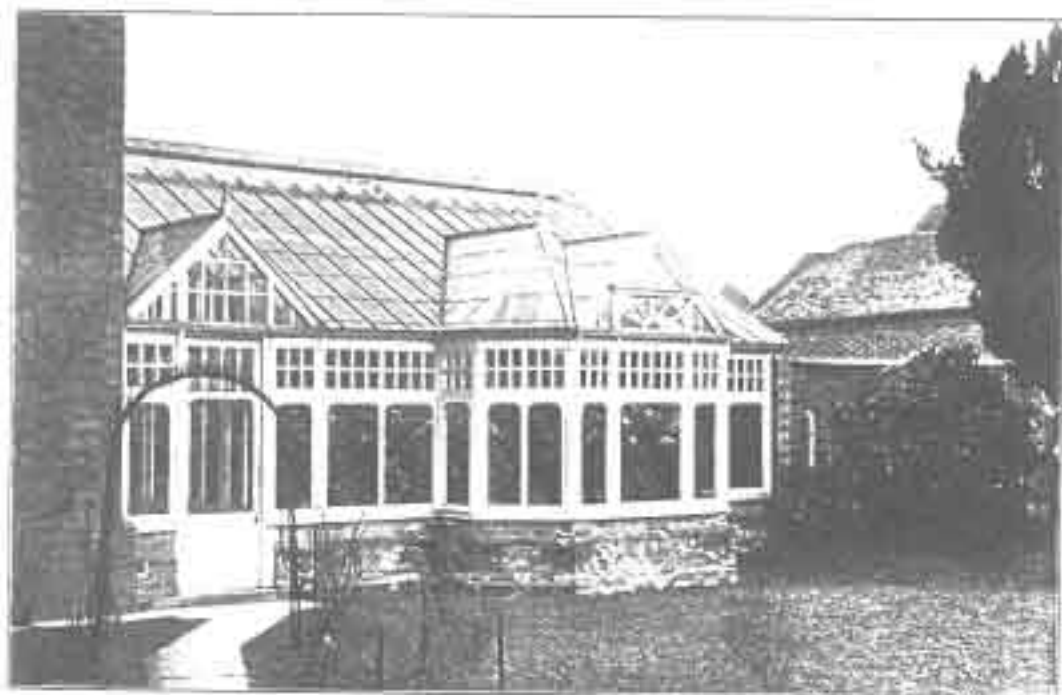

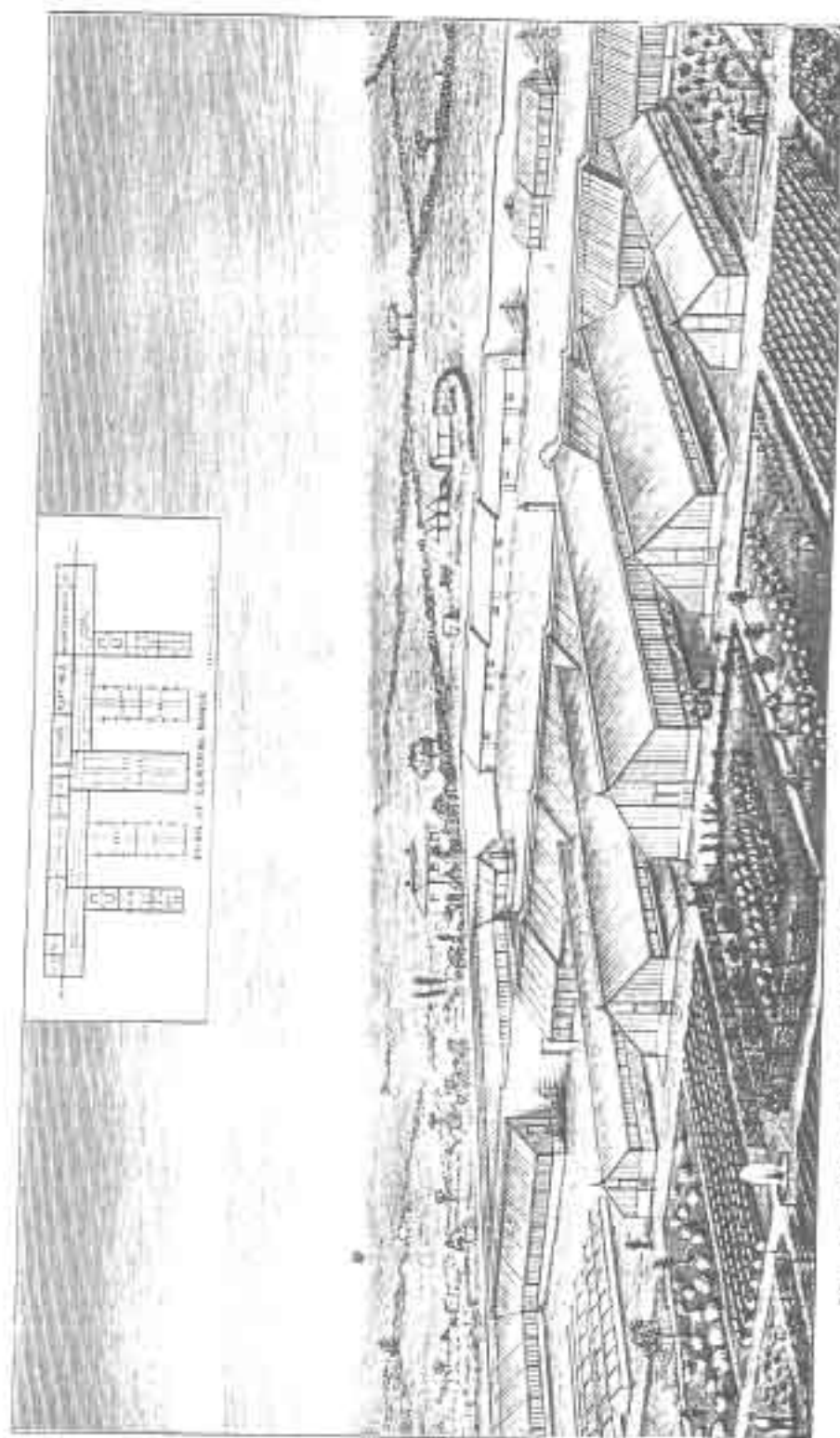

No. 25.—CONSERVATORY erected for Miss Harding, The Hermitage, Doddington, Cambridge.

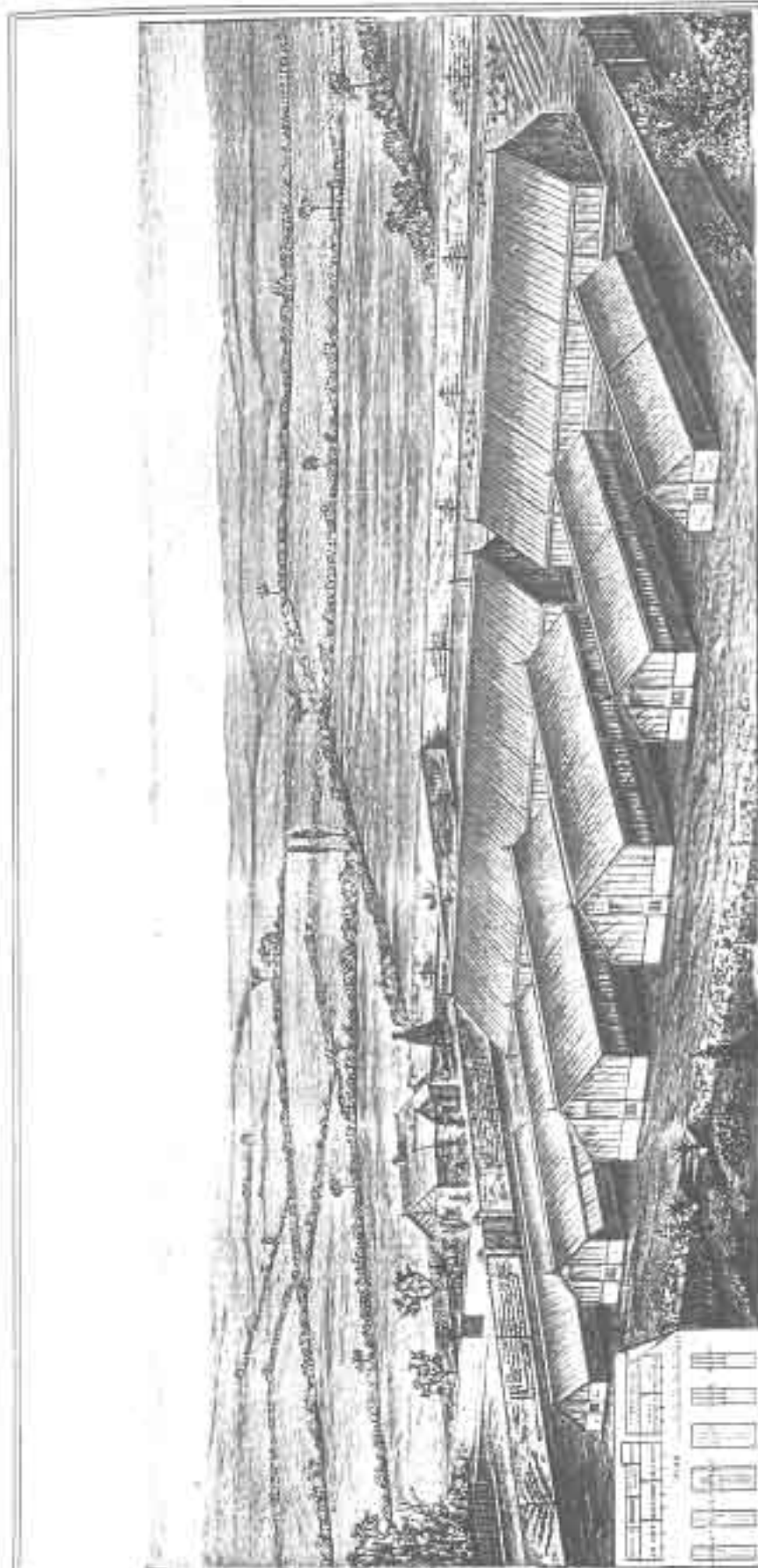


No. 26.—CONSERVATORY erected for Hon. Claude Portman, Goldcote, Stratford-on-Avon.

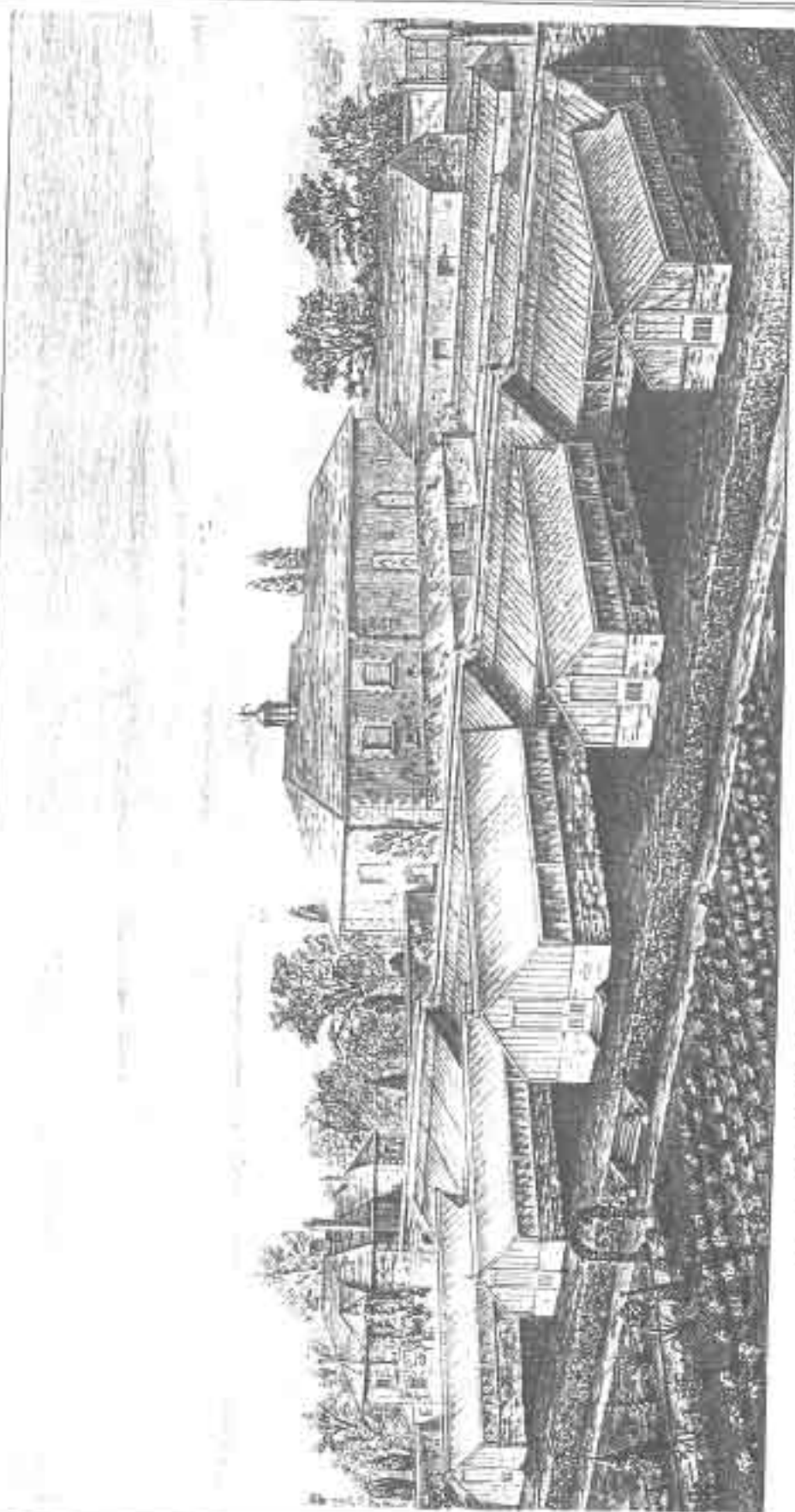

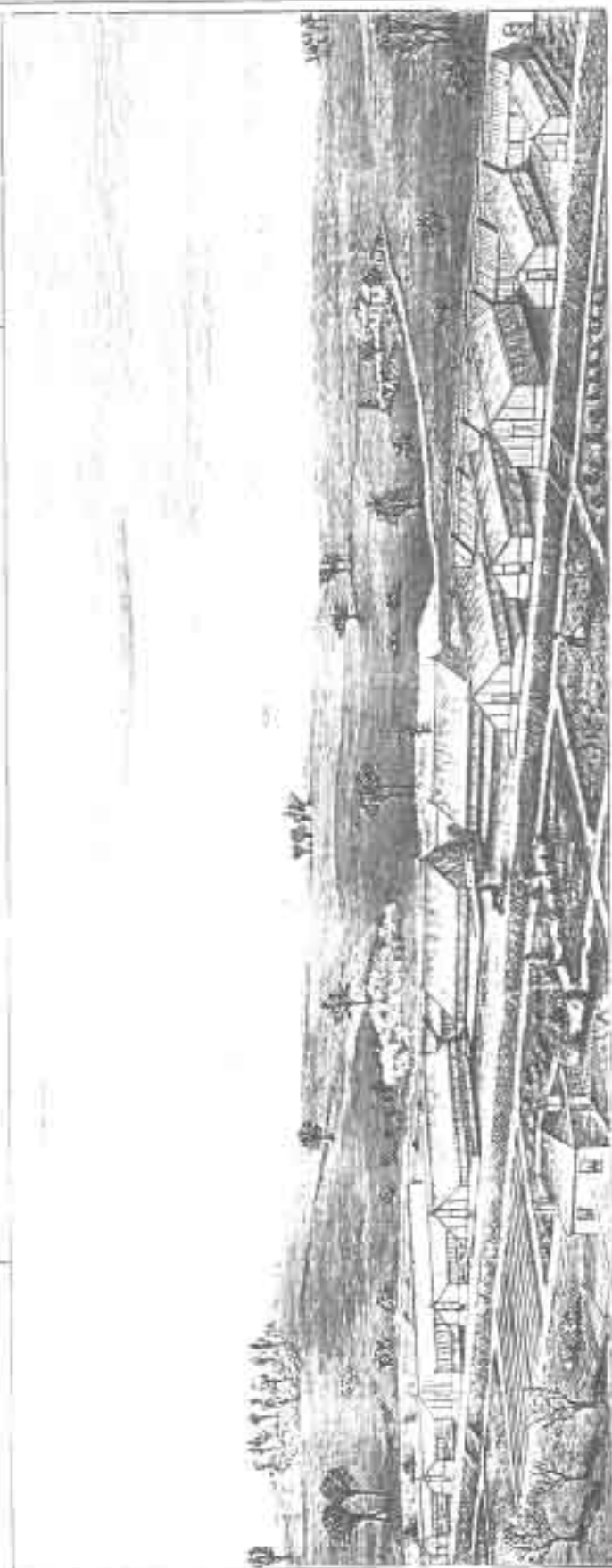

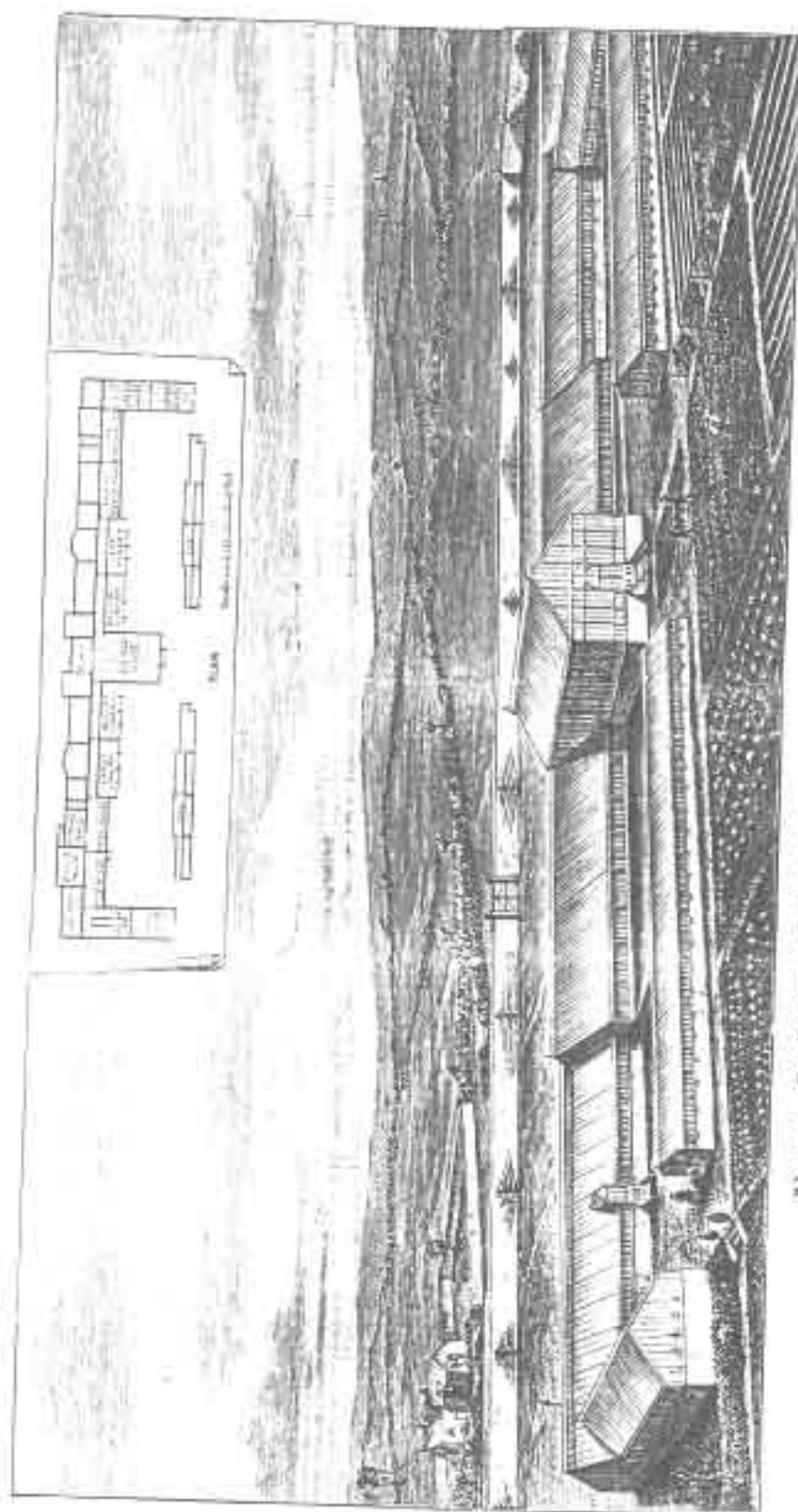


No. 29. RANGE OF HOUSES erected at Garton Park, Reigate, for Sir J. Colman, Bart.

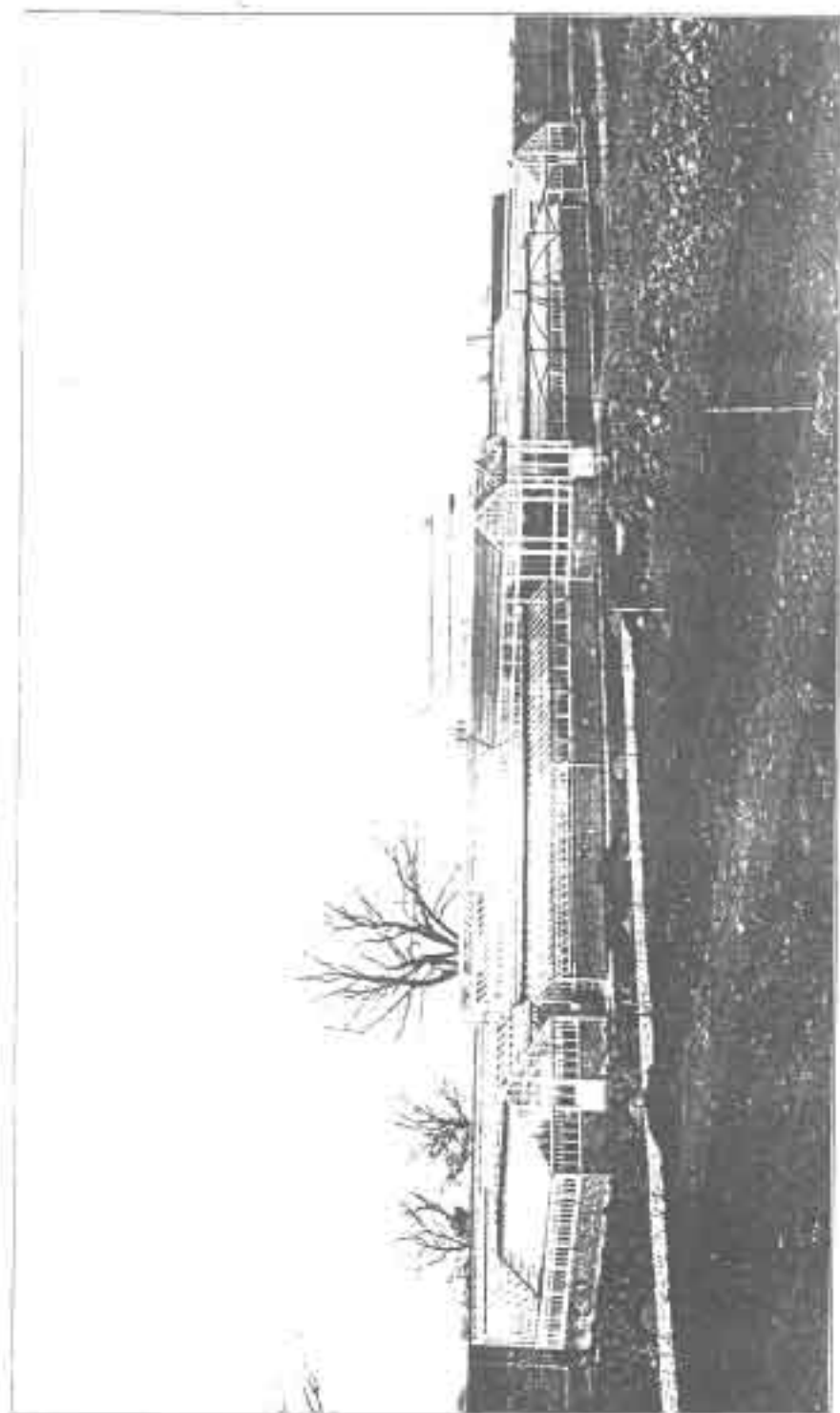
NO. 10. RANGE OF HOUSES erected at Askar, Yorks., for the Right Hon. Earl Zetland.

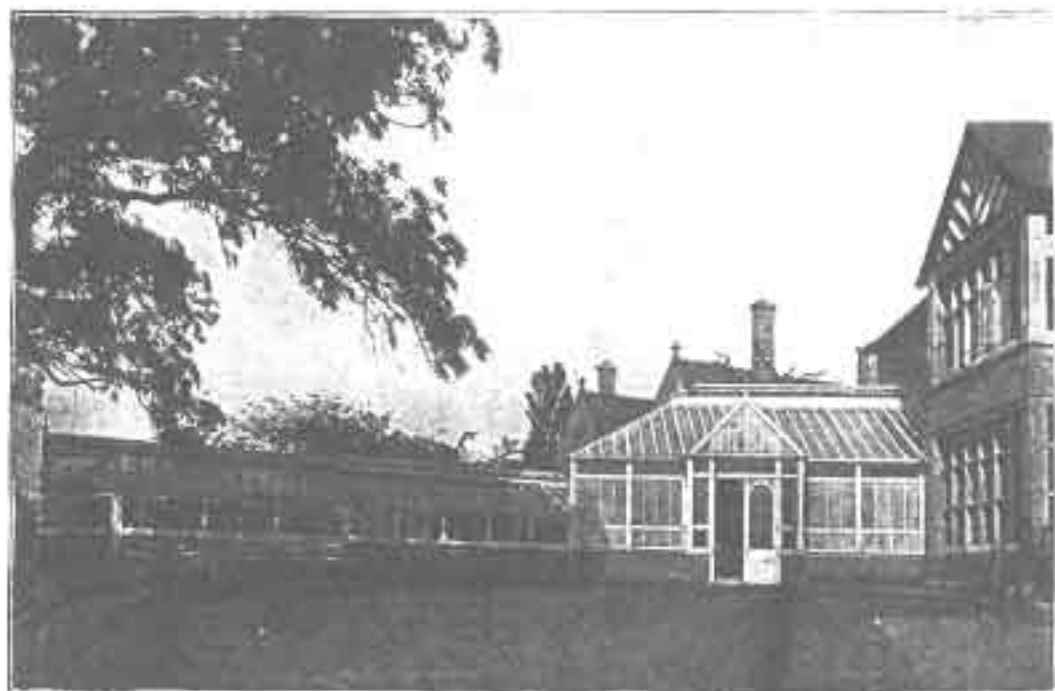

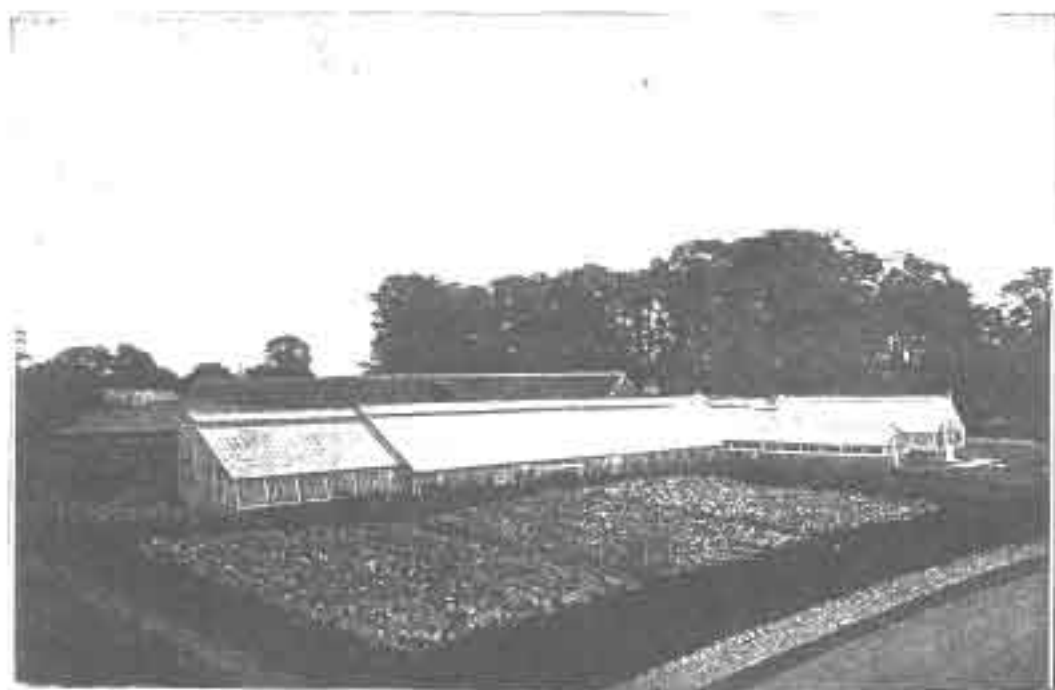

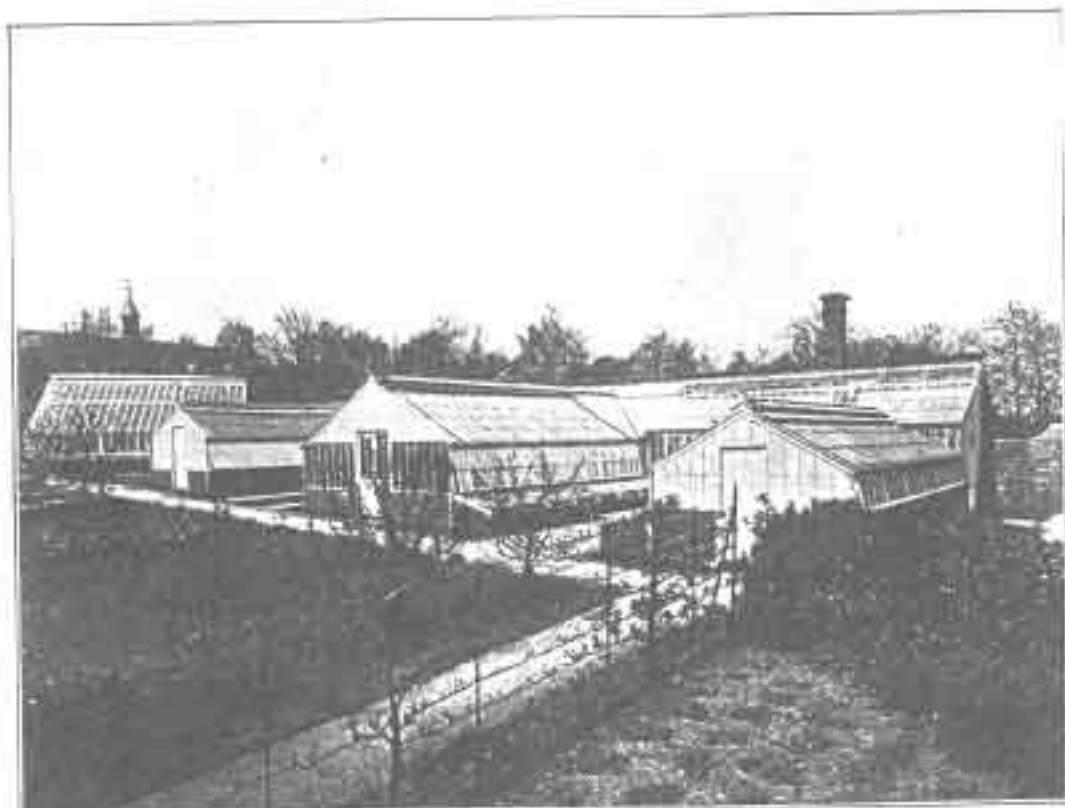


No. 33.—CONSERVATORY & PLANT HOUSES erected at Nottingham for  
R. Wilkinson, Esq., J.P.

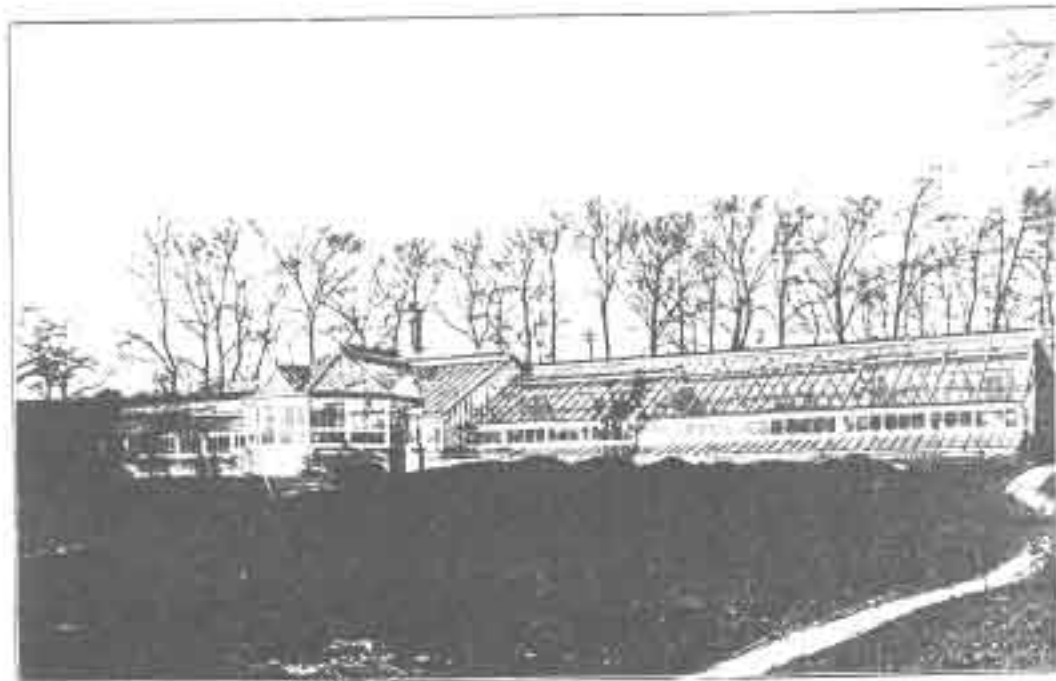


No. 34.—RANGE OF FRUIT & ORCHID HOUSES erected at Staunton Park,

at Ecclesall, Sheffield.



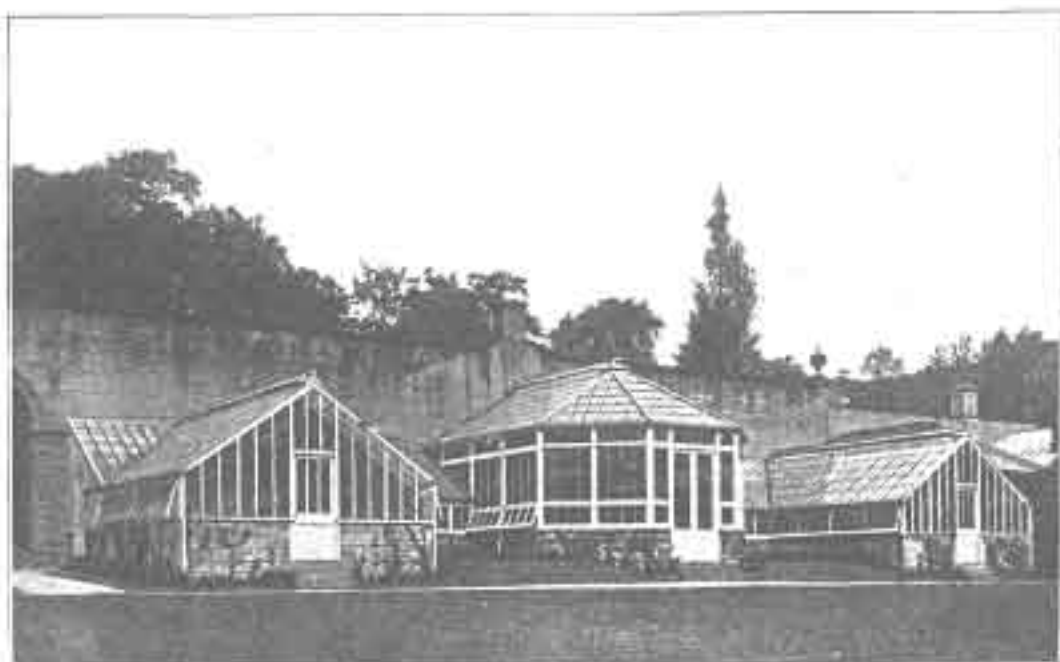

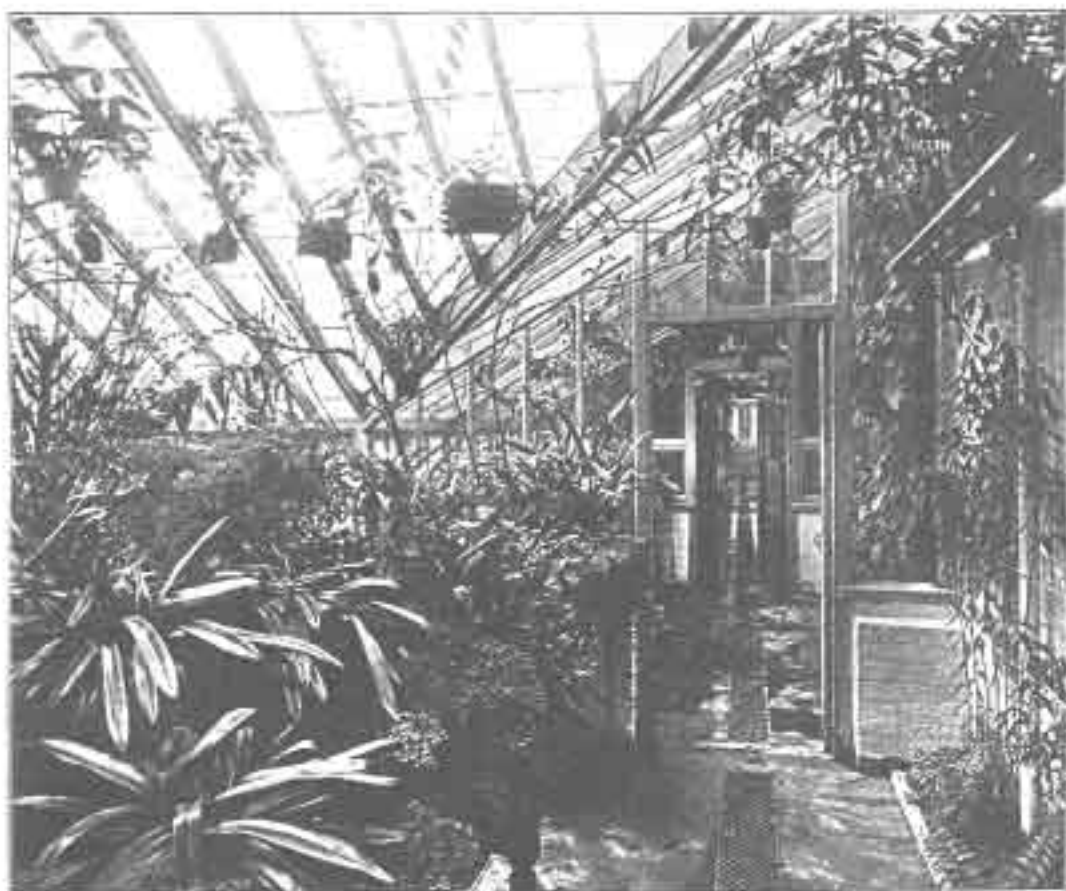

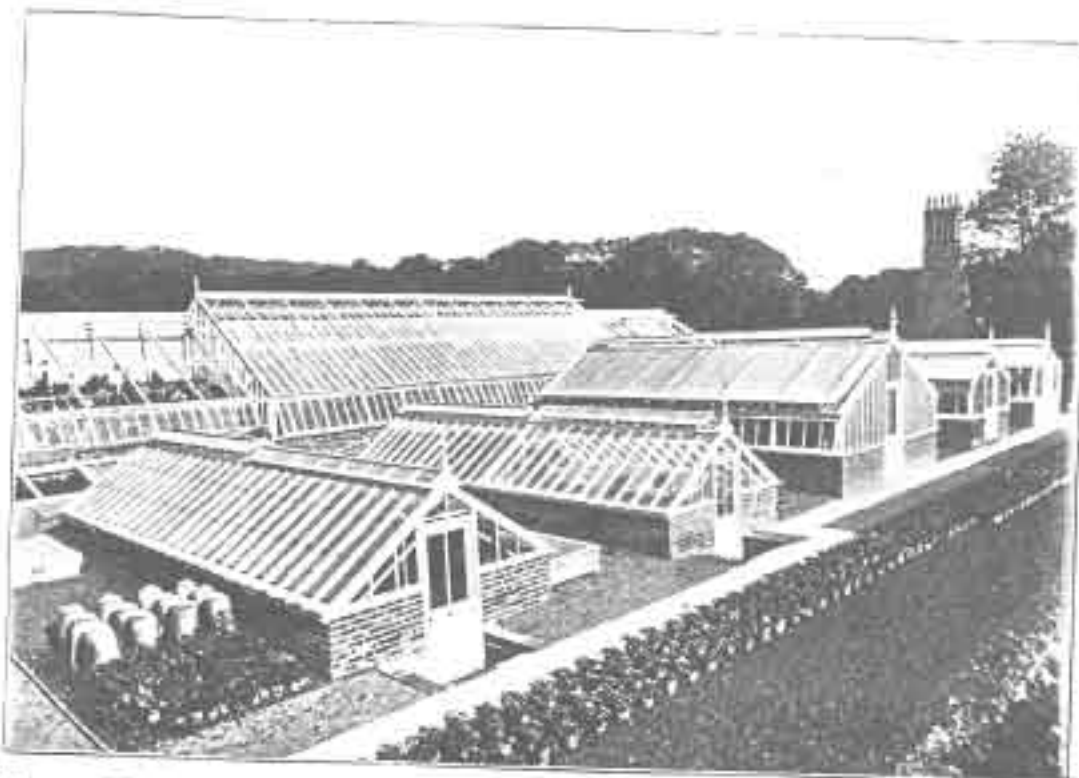


No. 38.—RANGE of HOUSES erected at Oakbrook, Sheffield, for Mrs. Mark Firth.

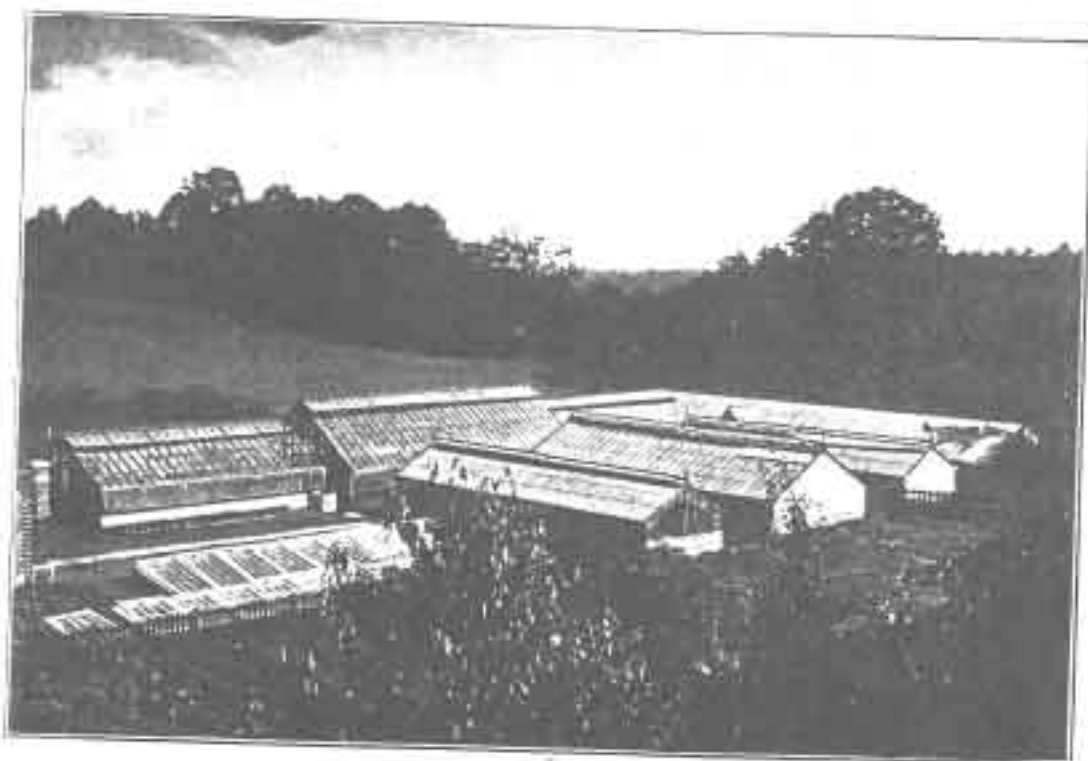


No. 39.—INTERIOR of above Range.

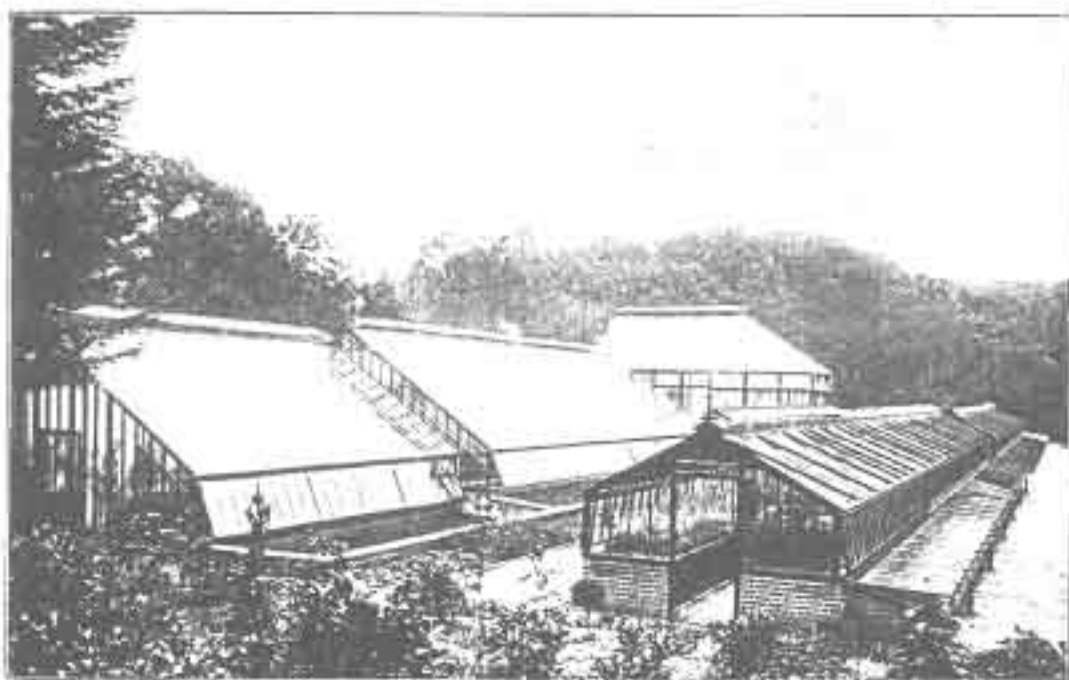


No. 41.—RANGE of HOUSES erected in Teak for Rt. Hon. Lord Grimthorpe, Wood Lee, Virginia Water.

No. 42.—RANGE of HOUSES erected for J. Calverley, Esq., Oulton Park, near Leeds.

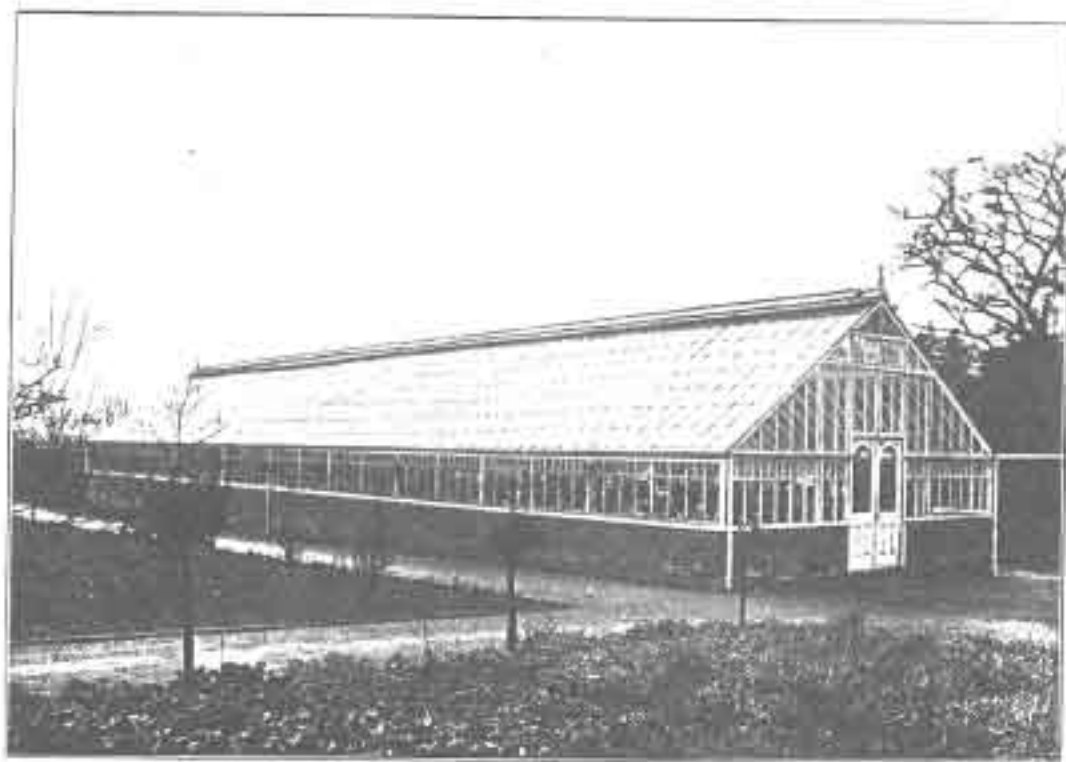


No. 43. RANGE of HOUSES in Teak, erected at Holmbury St. Mary, Dorking, for Walter Raphael, Esq.





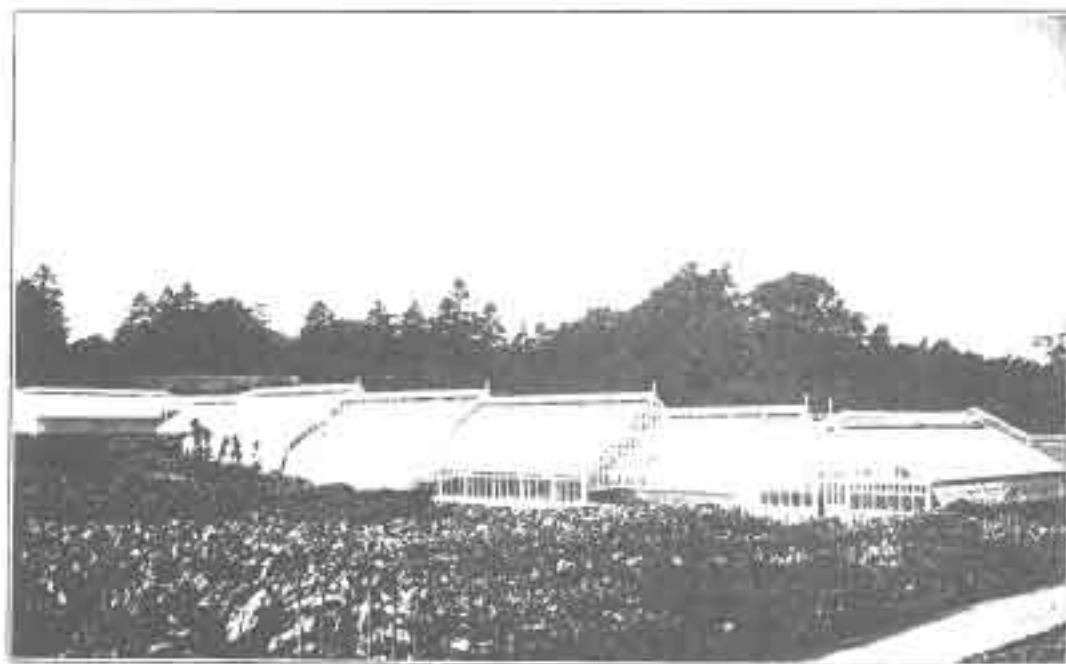

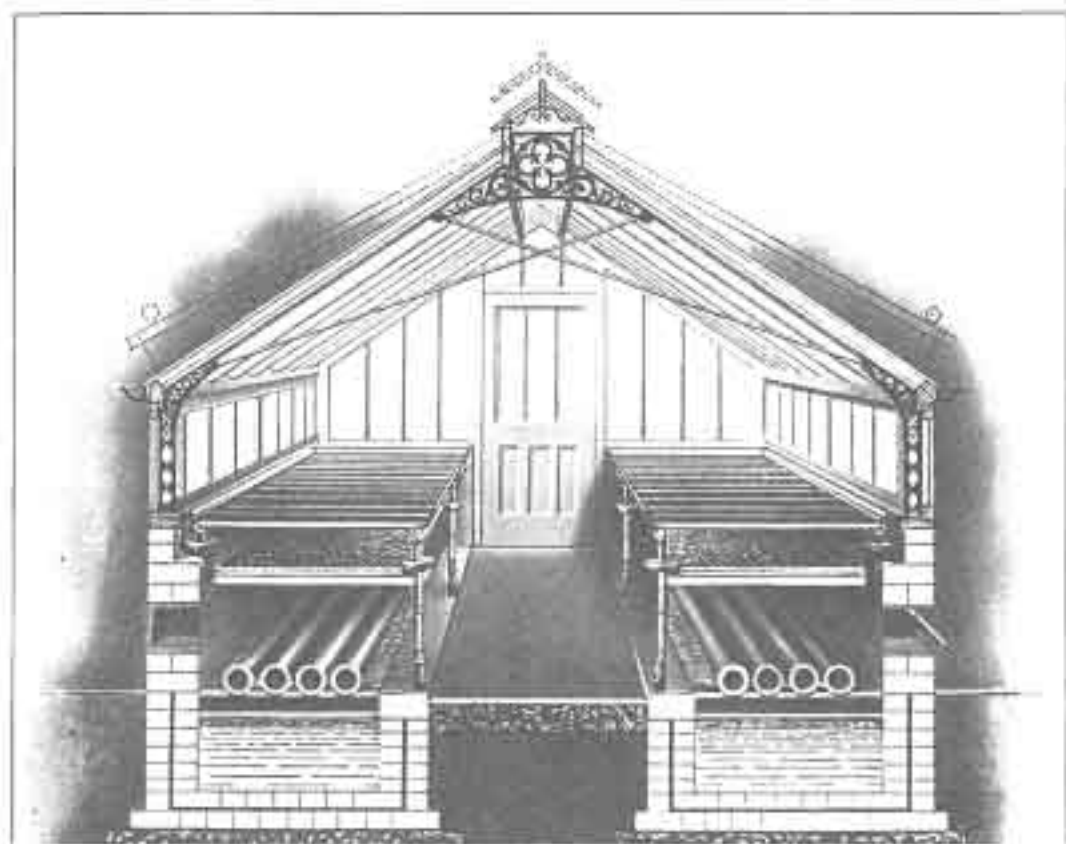

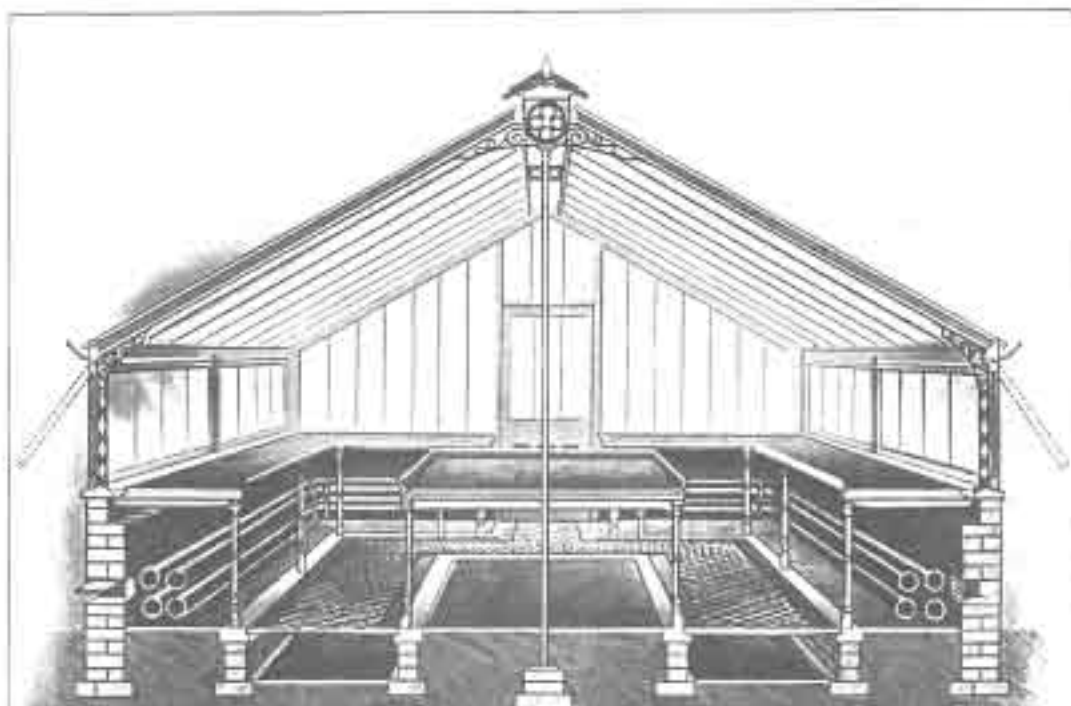

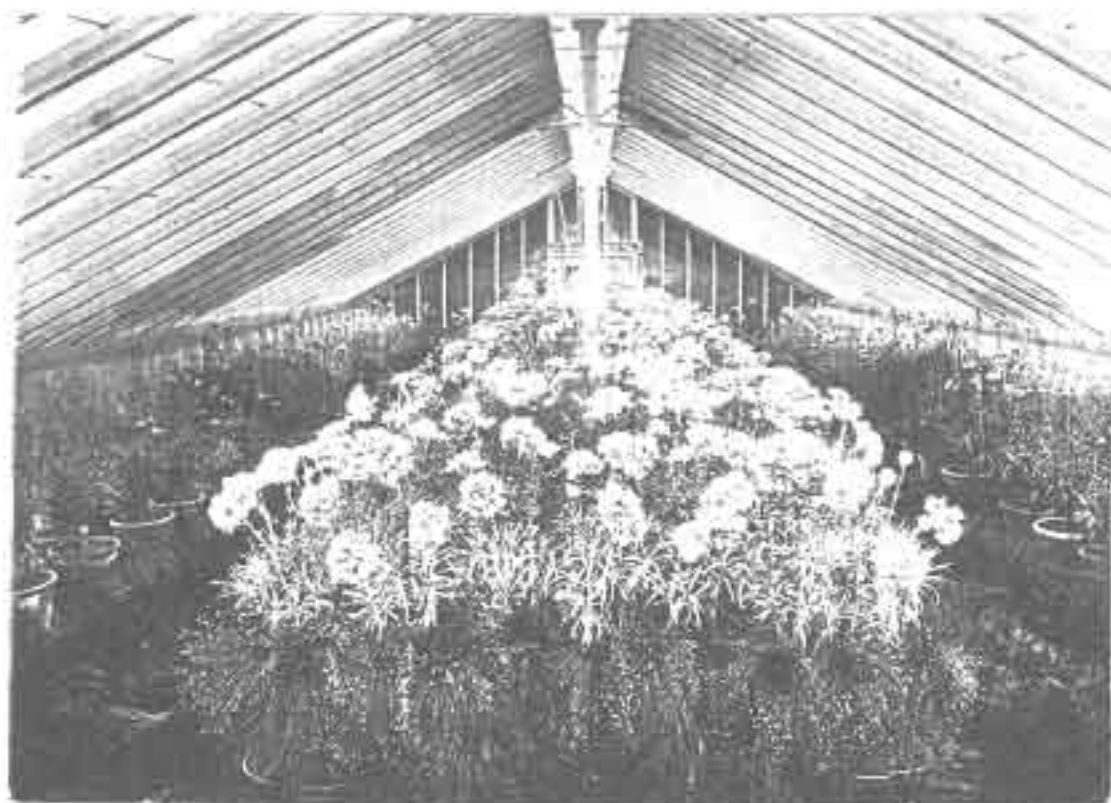


No. 51. SECTION of ORCHID HOUSE, 18 ft. or 20 ft. wide.

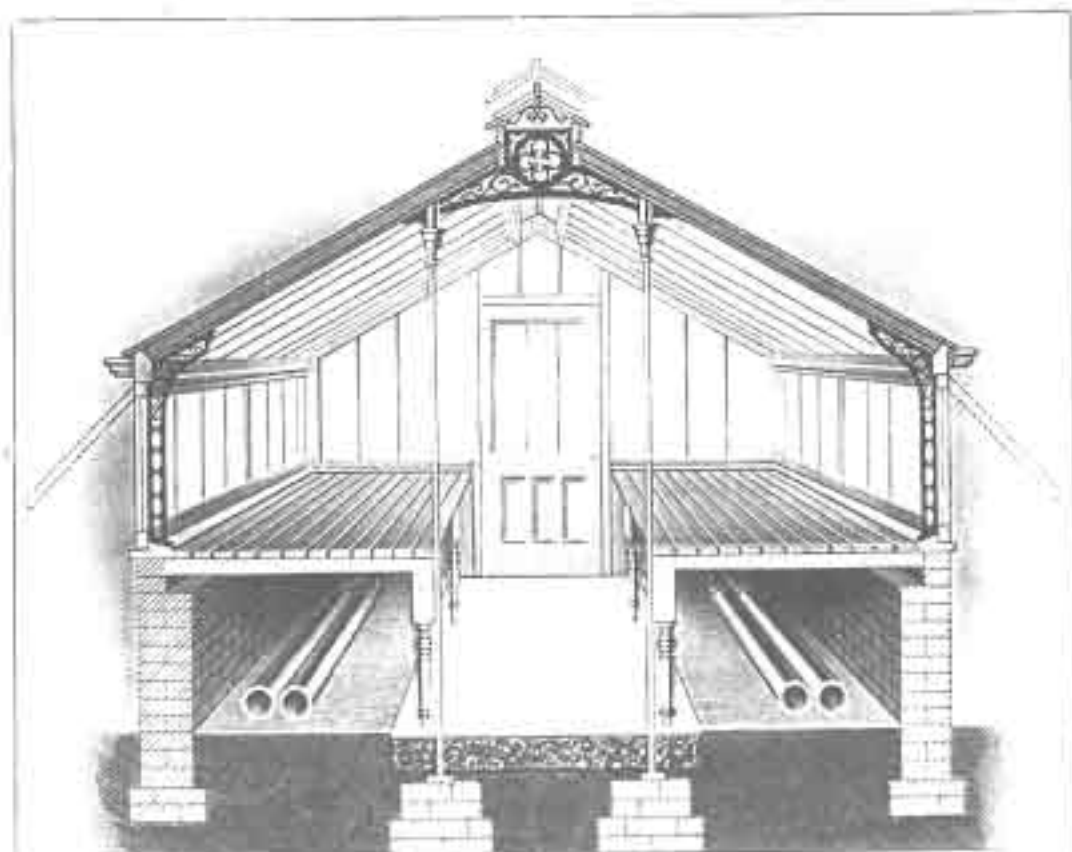


No. 52. —SECTION of CARNATION HOUSE, 18 ft. wide.

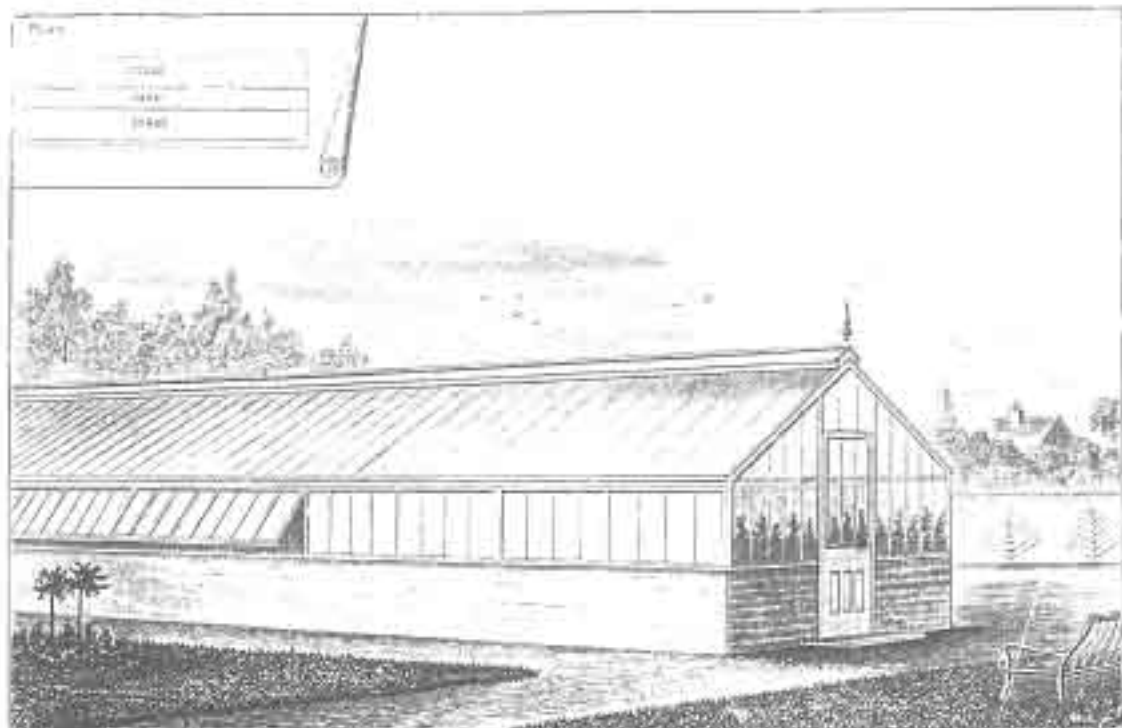


No. 53. —INTERIOR VIEW of above house erected for Leopold de Rothschild, Esq.



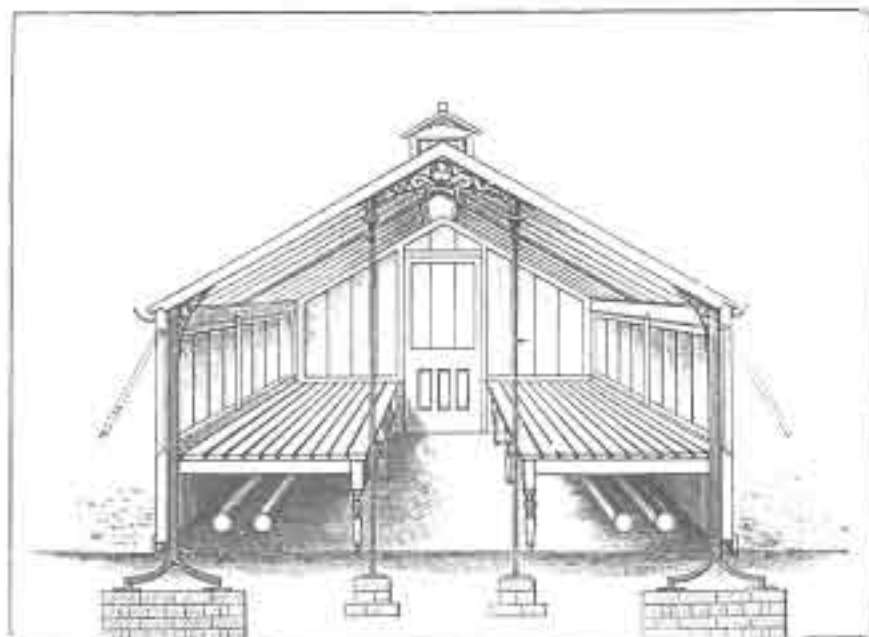


No. 54. SECTION OF SPAN PLANT HOUSE, 12 ft. wide, with lantern ventilation.



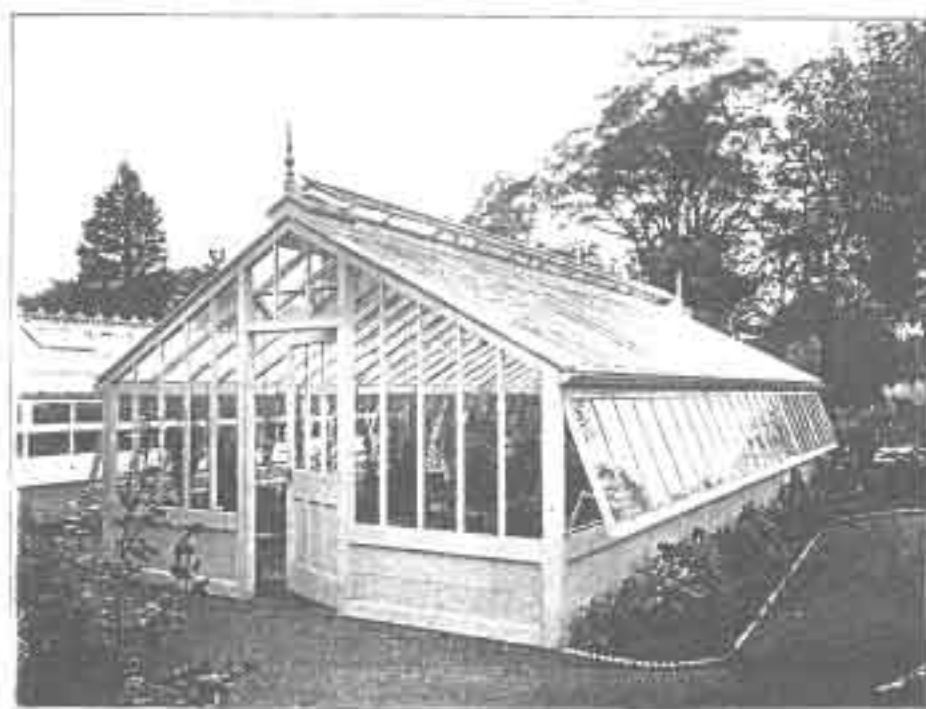

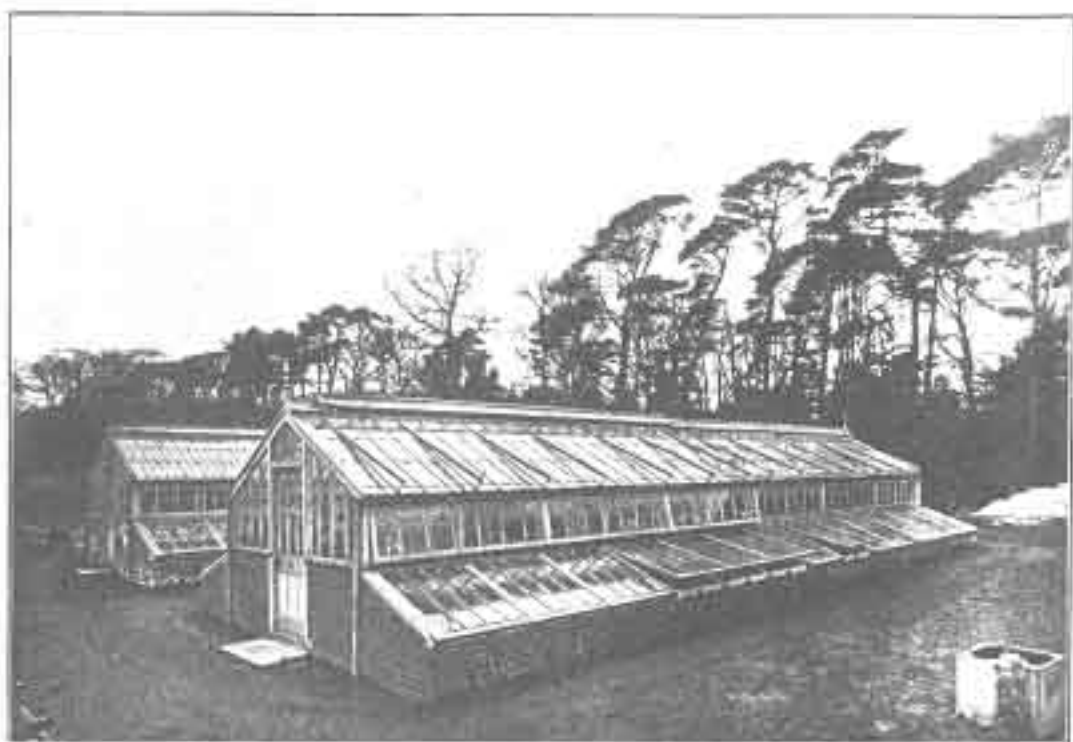


No. 56.—MOVABLE HOUSE ON IRON STANDARDS.

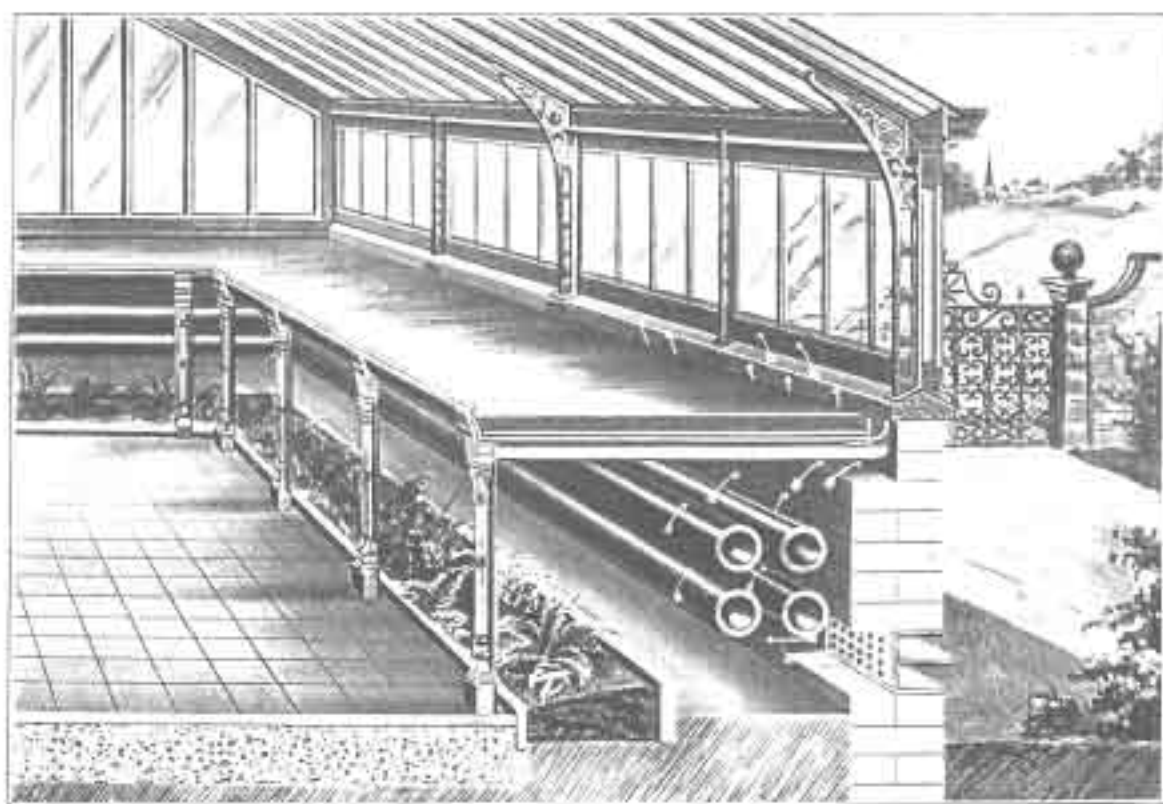

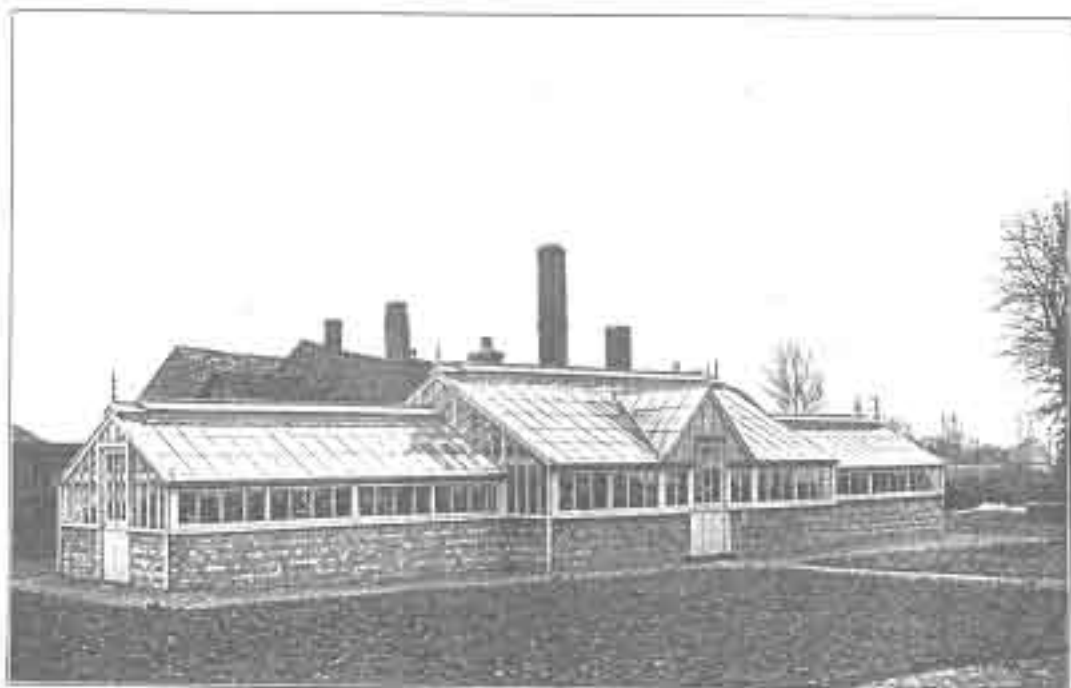

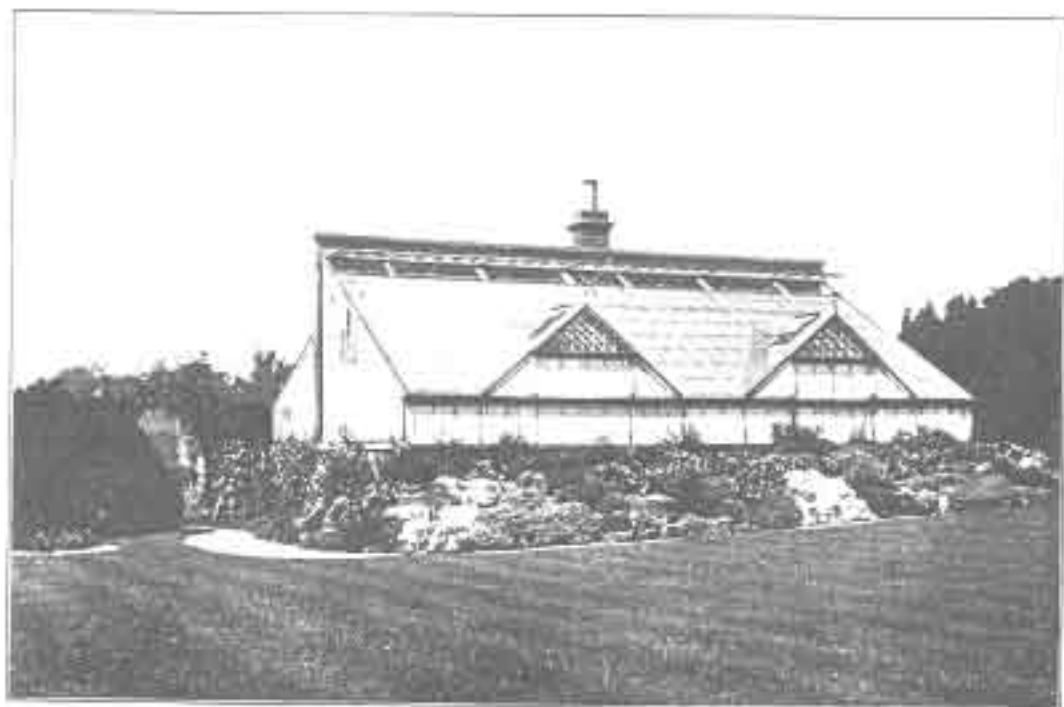

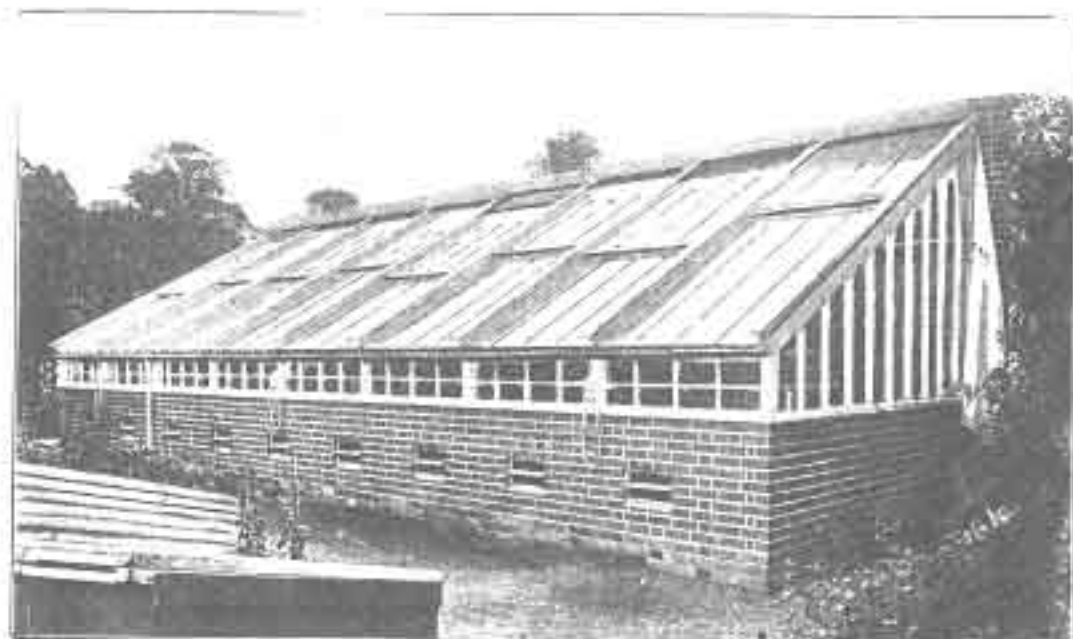

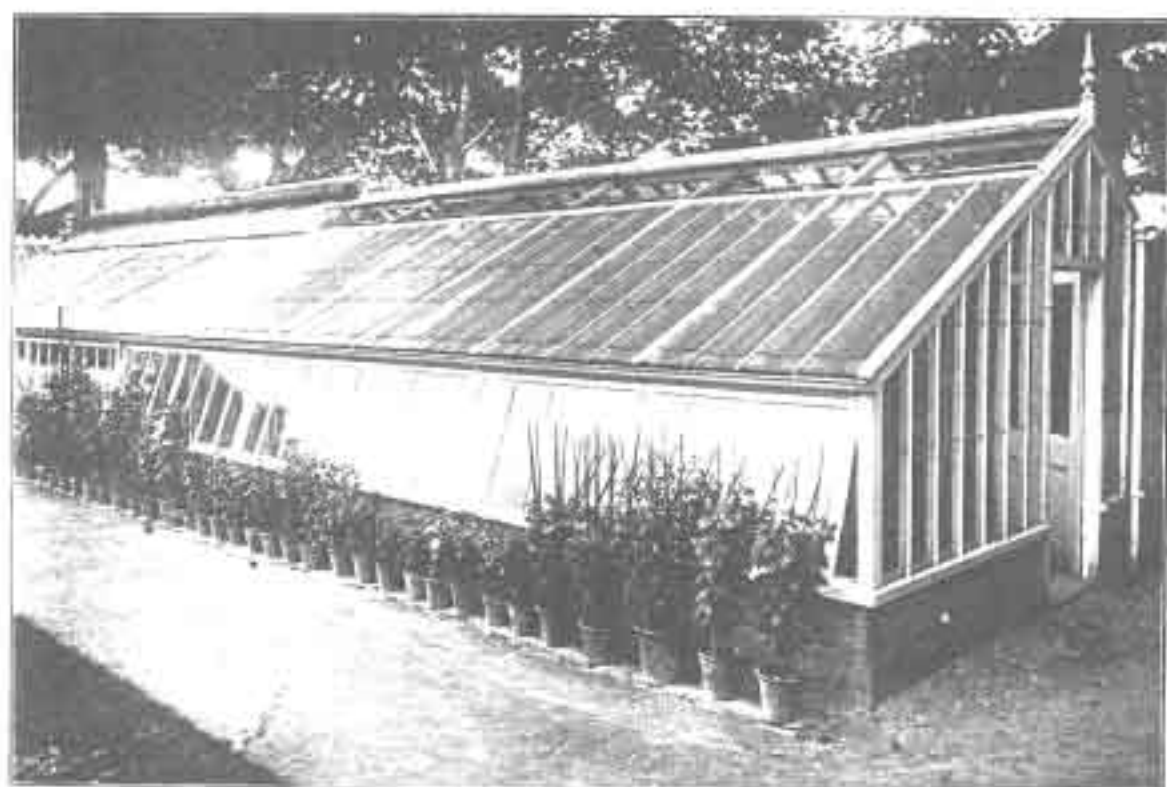
No. 60.—RANGE of SPAN HOUSES erected at Tansor Court, Quidley,

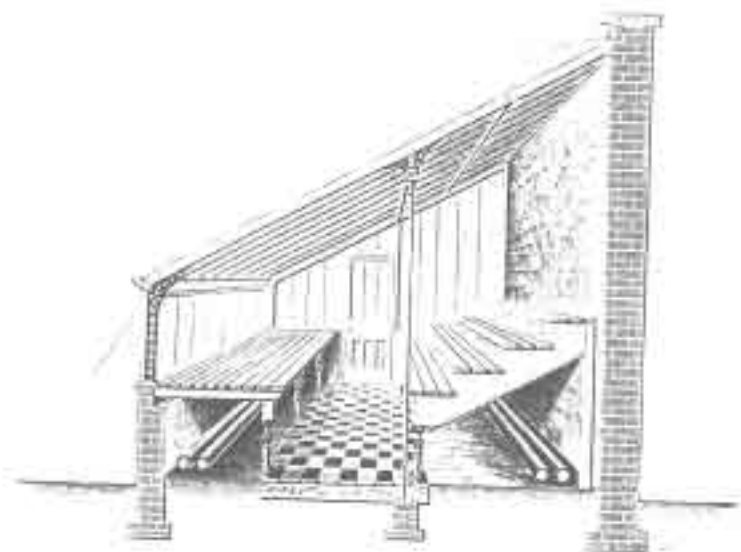

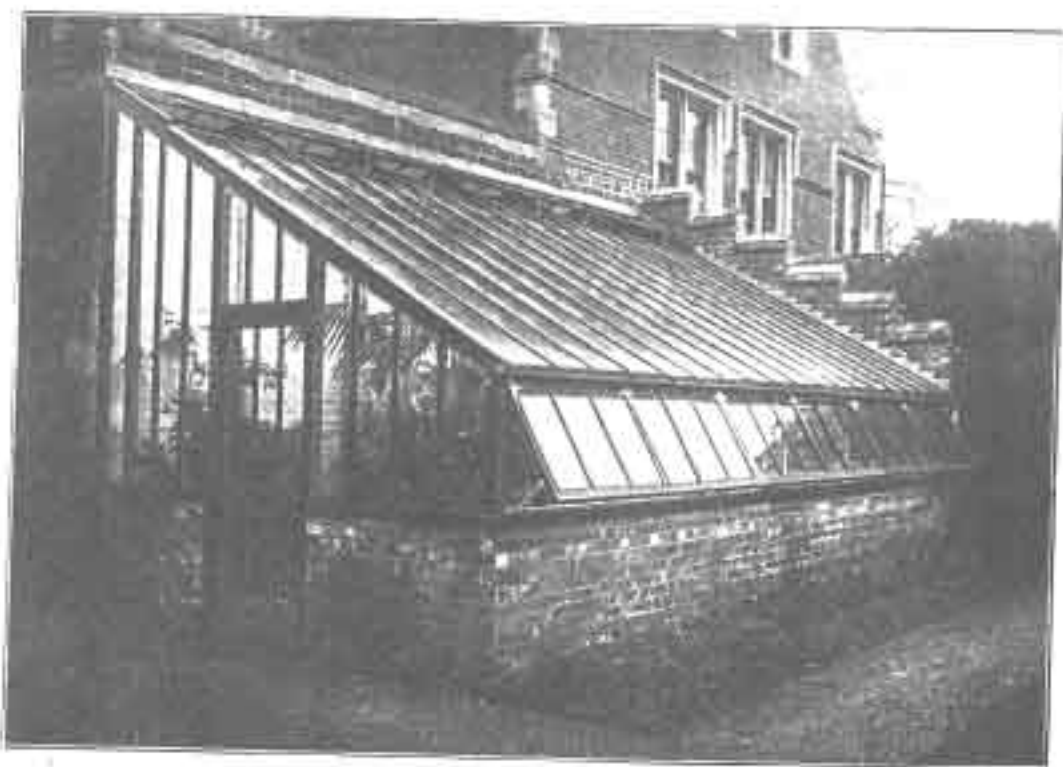


No. 63.—THREE-QUARTER SPAN PLANT HOUSE, erected at Moor Allerton, for J. Ward, Esq.



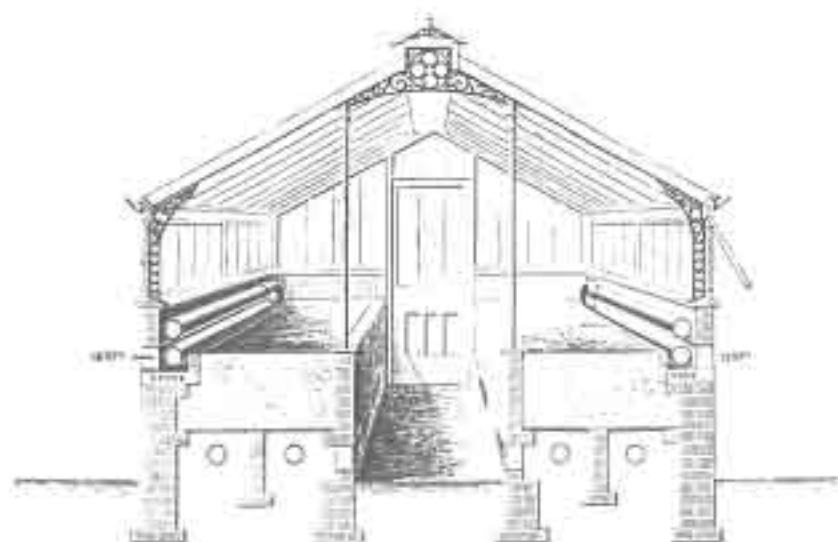


No. 64.—SECTION of LEAN-TO PLANT HOUSE, 12 ft. wide.

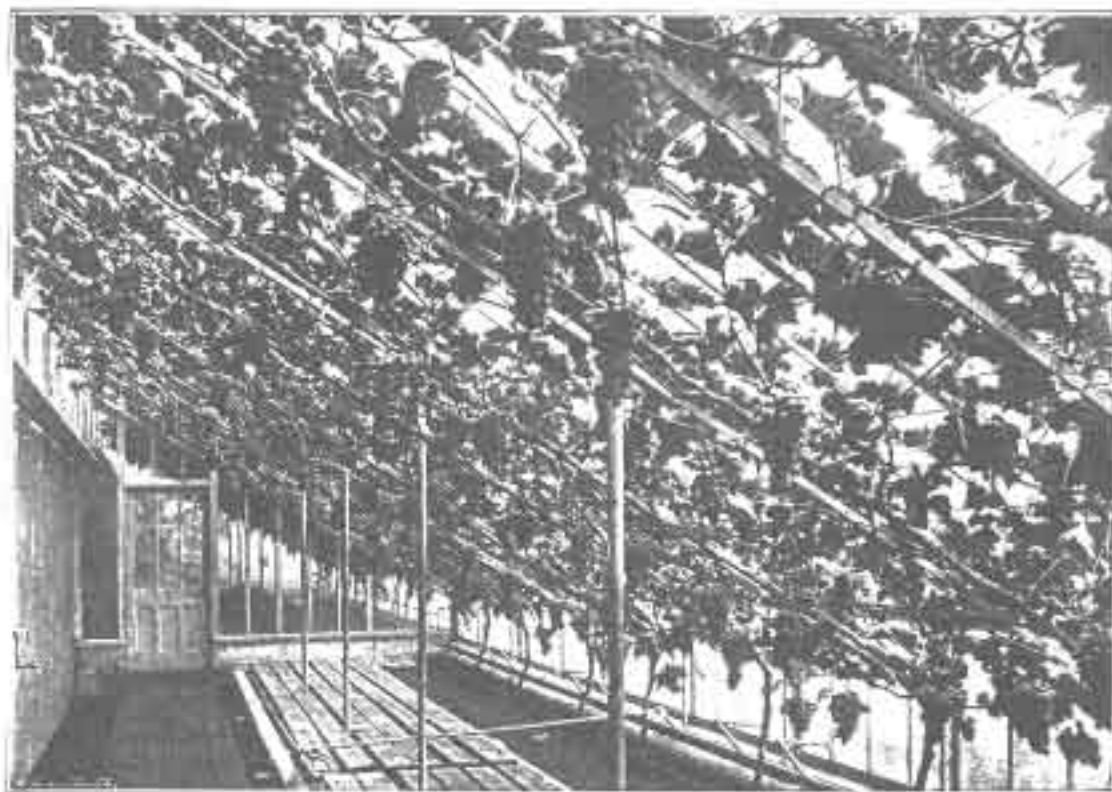

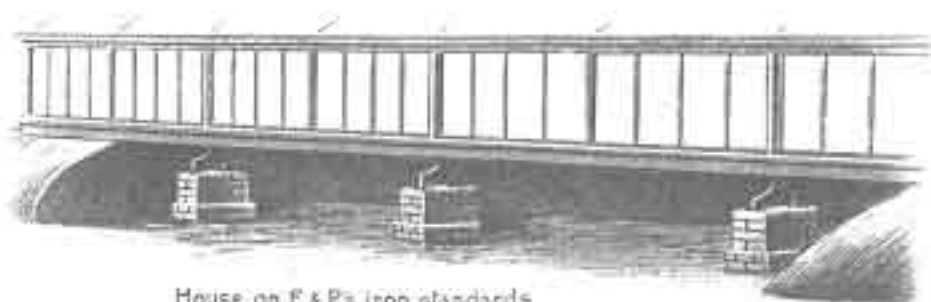

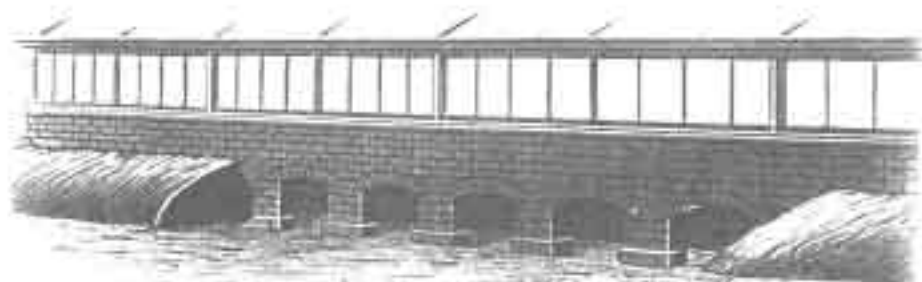


No. 69.—INTERIOR OF VINERIES erected for W. K. D'Arcy, Esq., at Stanmore Hall, Middlesex.

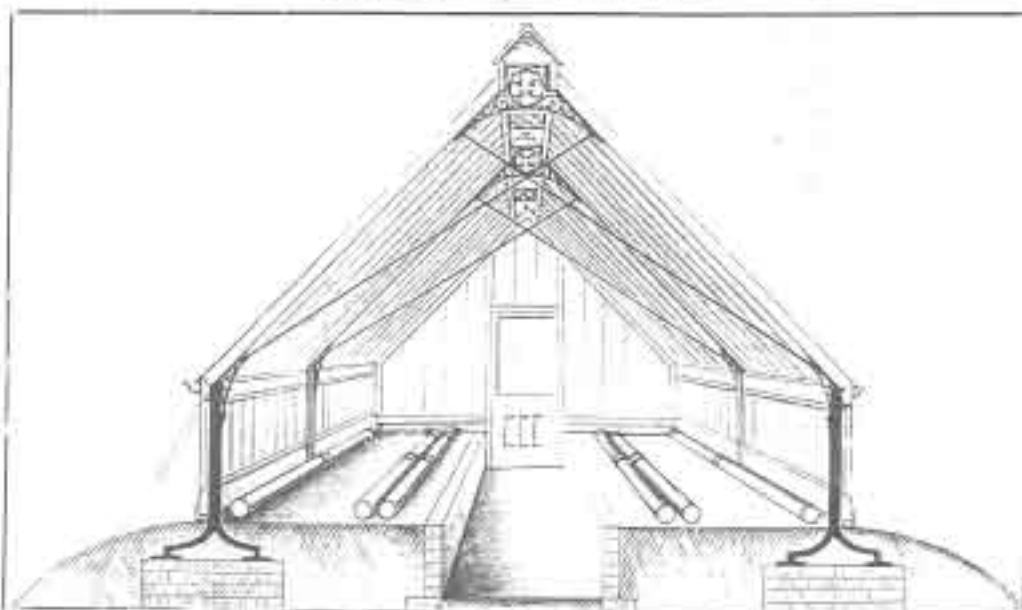
House on F. & P.'s iron standards



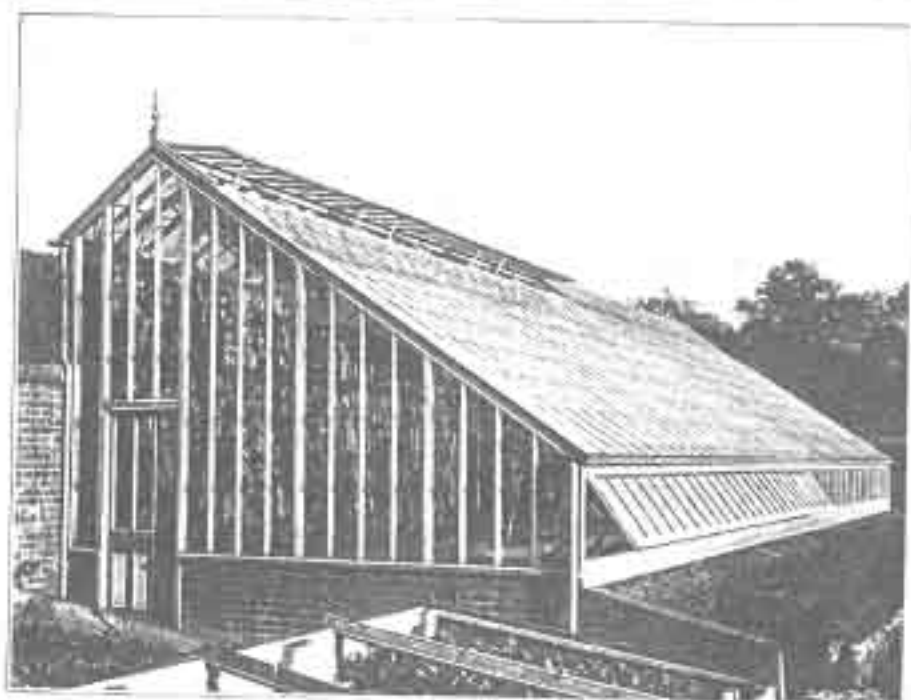
House on usual brick wall with arches

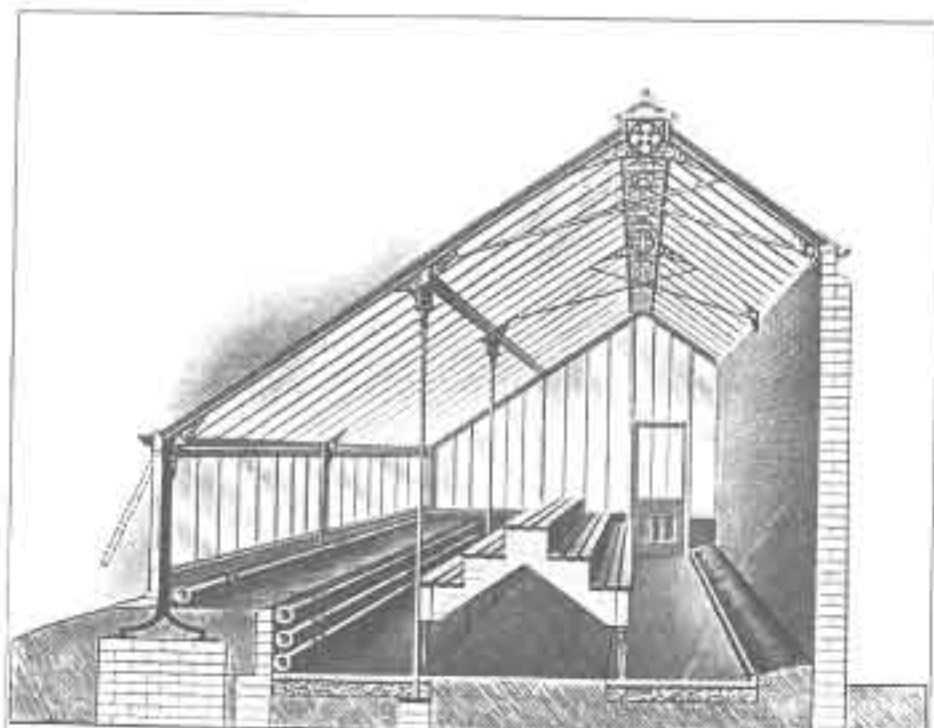

No. 71. SECTION OF VINERY, 14 feet to 16 feet wide, with square pitched roof, border 18 inches above floor level.



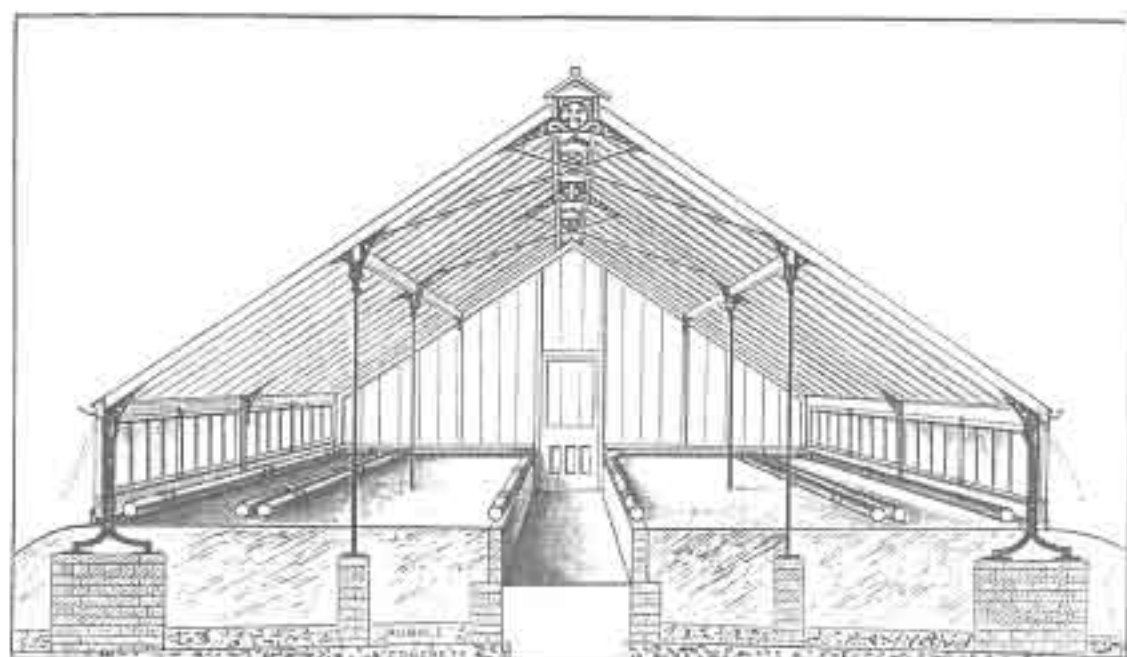

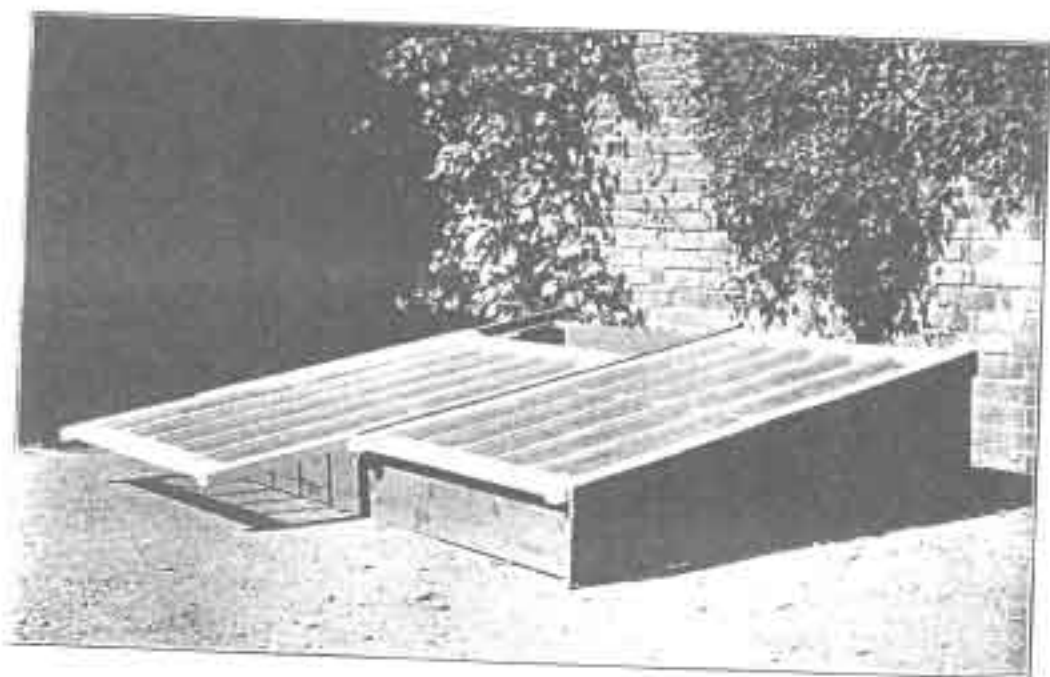


No. 87. FORCING PIT, with Sliding Lights.

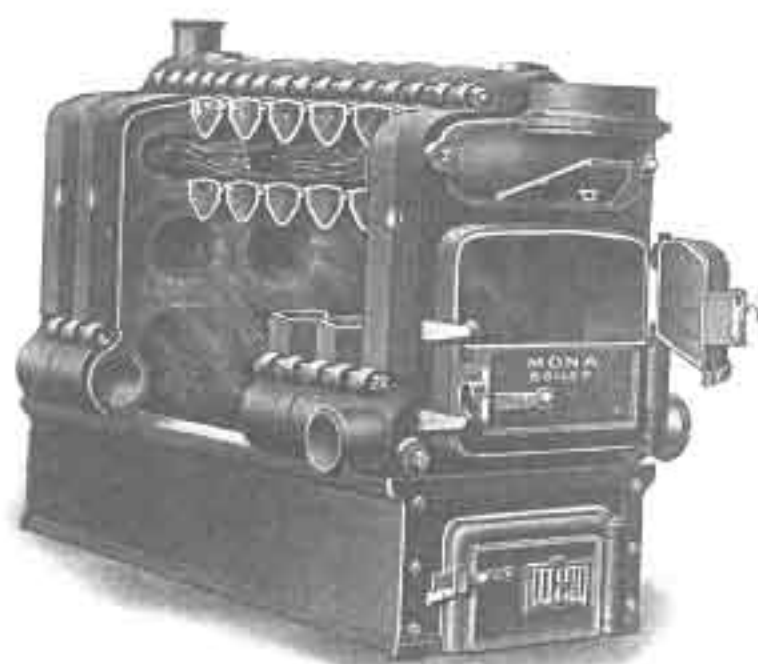

Sectional View of Monna Boiler.

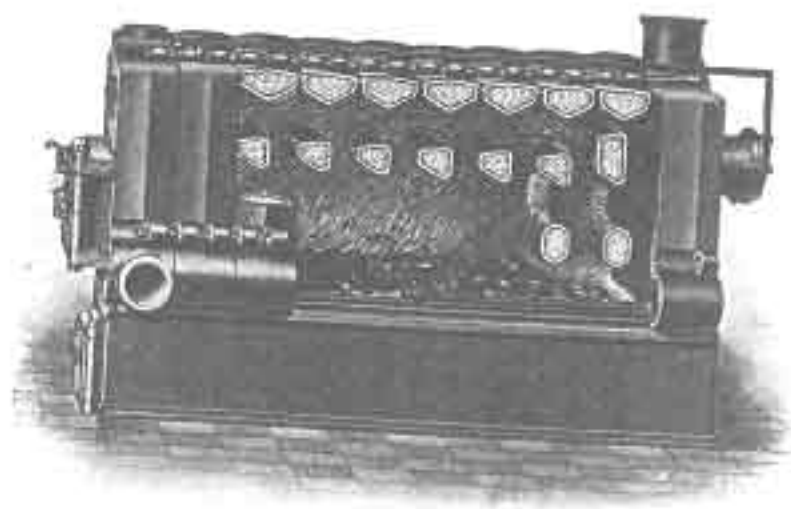

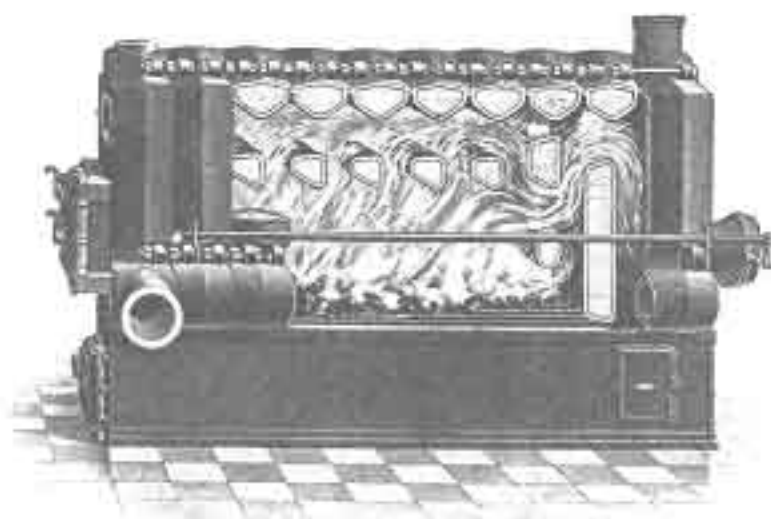

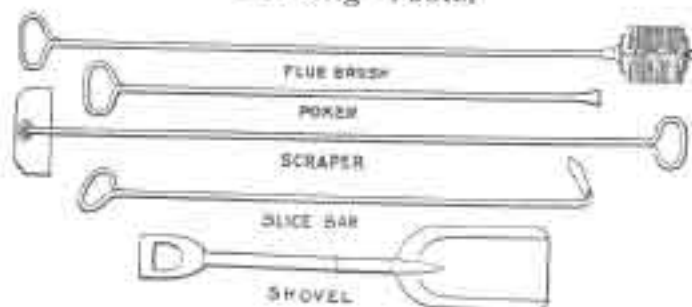
